### PLAN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE SALES OF BLEACHED FLOUR

#### Leading Milling Interests Are Behind New Law to Safeguard the Consumers.

Leading flour milling interests are preparing an ordinance which they will submit to the city council of Portland tonight for its consideration. It is a bill which would prohibit the sale of bleached flour in the city. Later the same bill would take the measure to the state legislature and endeavor to secure the passage of a state law prohibiting the sale of bleached flour.

The bleaching of flour is all wrong, says Theodore H. Wilton, president of the Portland Flouring Mills company, and we are going to make an effort to give the public what it pays for.

"They bleaching is restricted to only by those millers who want to purchase a low grade of wheat and by the use of electricity and soda, give the product a whitened appearance that will fool consumers as to the quality of the flour.

"There is a law in Washington state that would stop the bleaching of flour there as well as a selling of product that does not show full weight.
