PENNSYLVANIA WILL TAKE PLACE OF BOSTON

Following the publication of an official order by the secretary of the navy to the effect that the Oregon naval militia would be permitted to use the cruiser Boston for the purposes of a practice cruise comes the announcement that the navy department has arranged for the use of the armored cruiser Pennsylvania by the naval forces of Oregon on its annual cruise next July.

Lieutenant W. H. Toak, U. S. N., naval recruiting officer in Portland, announced yesterday that the Pennsylvania will hereafter be used for the training of Oregon naval militia.

The Pennsylvania is one of the most powerful and speediest vessels in the navy. She has a displacement of 13,650 tons, and an indicated horsepower of 28,000, with a speed of 22 knots. The vessel now lies at Bremerton navy yard on Puget sound and is manned with a skeleton crew. It is proposed to complete the crew from the Oregon naval reserve and send her for a month's cruise next summer.

ASKS COUNTY COURTS TO SUPPORT MEASURES

Letters have been sent by President C. T. Prall of the good roads association to every county judge and commissioner in Oregon, asking support for the harmony highway bill.

"I believe that the provisions contained in the county bonding act, the relation of the state highway commissioner to the court and other features of the bill should enlist every county court of the state in support of the measure," said Mr. Prall. "This for the reason that while a state-wide highway system is provided, no right of the county court is abrogated and no authority lost."

STATION "D" ACCEPTED BY P. O. DEPARTMENT

Official notification was received this morning from the postoffice department at Washington by Postmaster Merrick that the proposed location of station "D" in the fireproof building to be erected by M. Klapper, just south of Powell street, on Millwaukee street, has been accepted and a lease signed for 10 years. The new station is to have a floor space of 2578 feet, sufficient for year to come.

The station is to be fitted out entirely new and in the very latest and most modern equipment. The fixtures are to be of hardwood, as in all of the stations built within the last few years. The lease goes into effect July 1. The new location is a block from the old one. Two clerks and seven carriers comprise the force at present.
