Congressman Lafferty Replies to C. U. Gantenbein in Open Letter

Washington, D. C., April 18.

It pleased me exceedingly some time ago to note that a gentleman whom I have always held in such high esteem as yourself should be numbered among those who had been led to believe that the nation's newspaper attack upon me last summer marked the floodgate of their own political fortune.

But when I received from a constituent this morning a telegram saying that in yesterday's Oregonian, your campaign manager carried an advertisement over the name of James H. Davis, attempting to rob me of what little credit I am entitled to for faithfully performing my public duty...

The statements made by Davis are false. Every lawyer in Portland, including yourself, knows them to be false. The records of the federal court on the second floor of the postoffice building at Portland, Oregon, show that on September 14, 1907, I filed the suit of John L. Snyder, of Columbia county, against the Oregon & California Railway company...

It was not until September 8, 1908, that the government filed a suit for forfeiture, and when it did file this suit it had the benefit of all my investigation of the records of 18 counties in Oregon of which investigation of the government records at Washington, and the government adopted my complaint almost literally.

R. D. Townsend, special assistant, who filed the government suit, was not sent to Portland until July, 1907, which was one month after I had, without pay, made a complete written report to the attorney general concerning the law suit filed in the case. Townsend brought a copy of this report with him and based his action largely upon it.

At no time have I ever applied to the government for a position as special prosecutor in the case, and if you can prove that your man Davis did not make a false statement in that regard I will withdraw from the case. Over my frequent and insistent protests before Judge C. W. Wolverton, in open court, October, during the recess of Congress, I appeared in open court before Judge Wolverton and insisted that the case should be hurried along. I am going to keep on pushing the case with all the power at my command...

You had an opportunity when you filed your declaration as a candidate with the Secretary of State to pledge your official influence, if elected, to the rapid prosecution of this case to a conclusion. Why did you fail to make that pledge? Why were you silent on the subject? Therefore it has not been my purpose to state that you have a good reason for not antagonizing the railroad interests. But I now feel justified in doing so.

Night Hundred Thousand acres of the railroad lands were sold contrary to law to large purchasers. These purchasers have felt that they are also put in jeopardy by the litigation which I started. Fred W. Leadbetter, a non-in-law of H. L. Pittcock, is interested in thousands of acres of the lands bought from the company contrary to law. If the litigation against the company shall fail, or shall be dropped, the titles of Leadbetter will be secure. Pittcock owns two-thirds of the stock of the Oregonian Publishing Company, which publishes the Oregonian and Telegram. Your brother-in-law married one of Mr. Pittcock's daughters, so that you are very close relations with the Pittcock family.

Therefore, it is not strange that the Oregonian should have launched your candidacy in most flattering terms on Sunday, January 21, wherein it stated that you had only consented to become a candidate "after weeks of pleading."

That being true, and the "pleading" manifestly having come from the Oregonian owner, it is not surprising that enforcement of the land grant is not one of the planks of your platform. There was no occasion for you to run this year except to gratify the desires of Congress. You were compelled to bottom your campaign on the malicious assaults made upon me, and to adopt those methods. Otherwise you were left without a leg to stand on. Therefore, the Davis statement of yesterday is a logical sequence of your candidacy, launched as it was by the same crowd that launched the fight upon my private character last August.

I regret exceedingly that the time is now too short for me to come here to discuss this matter before my constituents face to face with my trustees. But I shall do that as soon as Congress adjourns. You are invited to meet me upon the platform, if you dare do so at that time and so if you can make your charges stand up under a public open discussion of all the facts before the people.

This onslaught upon me has been carried on so systematically that I feel that my constituents are entitled to an open trial of the matter with the principals face to face with each other upon the platform and in the presence of the people, and such an opportunity will be given during the coming summer.
