

### MULTNOMAH WILL CAST 1-3 OF VOTE OF ENTIRE STATE

Primary Vote Expected to Be Larger Than Usual This Year; Estimate Registration of State 130,000.

Multnomah county will cast approximately one-third of the vote of the state today. It has about one-third the total population, and the vote in a large city is proportionately larger than in the rural districts.

The primary vote is expected to be proportionately larger than usual this year for two reasons. The polls are open all day, instead of half a day, and unusual interest has been crowded into the campaign, because of the hot fight for president and United States senator in this territory.

Secretary of State Glavin estimated the registration for the state at 130,000. Multnomah county registered 43,121, or a little more than one-third. Reports from other counties in the state generally show lively interest and a large gain in registration over 1912.

4500 Democrats May Vote.

The Republican registration in Multnomah is 35,772, and if 75 per cent of the total is polled, there will be 26,900 Republican votes cast. Probably the vote will be around that figure. By the same token, the Democrats will cast about 4500 votes, out of a registration of 6322.

In Marion county, having the second largest registration in the state, there are 217,177 listed the Republicans having 8441 and the Democrats 1442.

In Linn county the registration reached 417, the Republicans having 2301 and the Democrats 1493. In Jackson county nearly 4000 are registered. Washington county reports 400, a gain of nearly 1000. The Republicans have 2037 and the Democrats 622.

The registration books in Polk county contain 2377 names, the Republicans having 1280 and the Democrats 819. Yamhill county has run up 2723, a large gain over two years ago, the Republicans numbering 1007, and the Democrats 892.

Registration in Other Counties.

Baker county has registered 3512.

with 1882 Republicans and 1719 Democrats. In Clatsop county the Republicans have 1882 and the Democrats 824, with a total of 2706, compared with 2191 two years ago. The Douglas county total is 4132, including 2218 Republicans and 1914 Democrats.

In Columbia county were the only precincts of light registration. The total in 1908, the Republicans having 1929 and the Democrats 234. The Republicans have 254 in Hood River county since the Democrats 219, in a total of 473, compared with 1948 two years ago.

In Washill, the Republicans have mustered 2072, the Democrats 837. Two years ago the Republicans registered 1842 and the Democrats 449. In Klamath county the total is about 2306, or 200 more than two years ago.

### OLLIE S. WILL GO ON EXCURSION RUN
