

# ROOSEVELT'S GAIN GROWING STEADILY

Official Returns From Twenty-five Counties Gives Him 8245 Lead Over Taft.

Theodore Roosevelt, steadily gaining as the later returns are received, now has 8245 votes more than Robert M. La Follette as the choice of the Republican vote for president. He has 3141 more than President Taft.

These figures include official returns from 25 counties of the state, and unofficial figures from the other nine. The total vote reported is 70,000 and only 2000 or 3000 votes are to be added, according to best estimates. This indicates that the ultimate plurality for Roosevelt will be about 6000.

On the official vote thus far canvassed, Roosevelt has carried Clackamas by 228 over La Follette, Columbia by 245 over Taft, Hood River by 31 over Taft, Josephine by 21 over La Follette, Klamath by 179 over La Follette, Lane by 238 over Taft, Tillamook by 17 over La Follette, Umatilla by 338 over Taft, Union by 143 over La Follette, Wallowa by 235 over Taft, Wasco by 115 over Taft, Washington by 184 over Taft, Baker by 265 over Taft, Benton by 42 over Taft, Lake by 25 over Taft, Grant by 199 over Taft, Marion by 144 over Taft, Malheur by 44 over Taft and Crook by 34 over Taft.

# SELLING HOLDING LEAD OVER BOURNE

Merchant Has 5718 Plurality According to Latest Returns.

With 25 counties officially counted, and added returns from some others, Ben Selling is holding his lead about even over Jonathan Bourne for the Republican nomination for United States senator. On the latest returns today he has 5718 plurality, and other counties will give him more.

With a total of 48,320 counted, Selling has 31,244, Bourne 35,448, Stephen A. Lowell 8019 and J. W. Meriton 1497. The vote for senator is about 2000 less than the vote on president.

# FEAR SENDS WU TO THE UNITED STATES

Price Put on Head by Manchus Causes Doctor to Accept Foreign Post.

Khanghal, April 25.—Fear of assassination by the Manchus, it was learned here today, was the reason which caused Dr. Wu Tingfang, who has been appointed Chinese minister to the United States, to seek a foreign post.

Dr. Wu, say friends in closest touch with him, has never fully recovered from the shock he received upon learning that the Manchus had offered a reward for his assassination, and still believes that China is unsafe for him. He was originally slated for the ministry of justice, but said he liked the diplomatic service better, expressing a preference for the United States.

# 12 OREGON COUNTIES GO TO WILSON; 9 TO CLARK, AND TIE IN 1

Harmon Has Total Vote of 667; Wilson's Majority Over Clark and Harmon is 784.

On the official figures of 25 counties, Woodrow Wilson has 13 Oregon counties to his credit, while Champ Clark has nine and in one county their vote is a tie. On the latest figures from the state, including 22 official and other counties, with the exception of two small counties, nearly complete, Wilson is 1451 ahead. He has a majority over both Clark and Harmon of 784.

Of the counties officially reported, Clark has carried only one in western Oregon. That one is Clatsop. Wilson lost most of the eastern Oregon counties but won in Hood River, Wasco and Umatilla, and ran a tie race with Clark in Grant.

The vote reported shows 2275 for Wilson, 1124 for Clark and 667 for Harmon. The total vote returned is 14,366, out of 18,000 to 20,000 in the state. Enumerating the counties covered so far by the official vote, Wilson carried Clackamas by 124, Columbia by 25, Hood River by 25, Jackson by 114, Josephine by 44, Lane by 301, Polk by 116, Tillamook by 7, Umatilla by 178, Wasco by 2, Washington by 61, Yamhill by 14. On unofficial returns from Multnomah, five precincts missing, he has 1407 plurality. Grant county is a tie between Wilson and Clark.

Clark came out ahead with 188 plurality over the Jerseyman in Klamath, 22 in Sherman, 25 in Union, 2 in Wallowa, 128 in Baker, 24 in Clatsop, 34 in Lake, 175 in Malheur, and 27 in Crook.
