YOUNG WILL CASE MAY BE REOPENED

Mrs. Mabel Young Warner to Spring Letters From Relatives of Dead Farmer.

(Special to The Journal.) Pendleton, Or., May 1.—That the next step in her long fight to obtain the estate of her deceased uncle, J. W. Young, will be to prove that the names of many of the heirs-at-law as contestants of the will, which she had probated and which was ultimately declared a forgery by the supreme court, were used without their authority, was the declaration made by Mrs. Mabel Young Warner today. She exhibited what purports to be a letter from one of these heirs as proof of her contention. This letter was signed with the name of Louis Young, nephew of J. W. Young, and it declares that Dr. F. D. Watts, husband of the principal heir under the accepted will, three years ago attempted to get the signatures of himself and other heirs to papers authorizing their names to be used in the proceedings, but that with one exception he met refusal.
