

PORTLAND MAN'S LIFE ENDS IN PATHETIC WAY

(Continued from the Journal.)
Vancouver, Wash., May 9.—George De Forest, 43 years old and with a wife living at 1104 East Taylor street, Portland, died at 4:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon at the Persevering rooming house, East Fifth and B streets, from consumption and alcoholism. He was found about noon in a dying condition and a physician was summoned, but nothing could be done for him. He reached Vancouver three days ago and was in the last stages of consumption. He drank heavily after reaching the city, and was on the streets yesterday morning a short time before being found in his room dying.

The body was taken to Knapp's chapel, where it will be held until the wife at Portland can be communicated with. In his pocket was found a ticket from Portland to Seattle, stamped across the face "Charity," indicating that it had been given him by some Portland charitable institution. In his pocket was a letter addressed to his wife, in which he threatened suicide and blamed her, saying if she had acted rightly they would be together.

According to Mrs. George De Forest, who is living with Mrs. C. F. Sperow, of 1104 East Taylor street, she did not know that her husband was in Vancouver, until she was notified by the Vancouver undertaker. She left him in Seattle, several weeks ago, where the couple had been living. She came to Portland, where she was taken ill and was confined in the Multnomah hospital, being released from that institution Sunday, April 28.

Mr. De Forest has been ill for several years, suffering from lung trouble contracted during the Spanish American war, when it is claimed he was struck by a bullet in the battle of San Juan Hill. In 1901 he was discharged from the army, and in November, 1902, the couple married. Shortly after the marriage they were divorced and lived apart for about four years when they were remarried.

From the east they moved to Seattle, where De Forest was a member of the Seattle camp of Spanish War veterans. Shortly before Mrs. De Forest was taken ill, she had formulated plans for taking her husband to the soldiers' home, at Santa Monica, Cal., where he could receive treatment for lung trouble.

BOTHERS UNITED AFTER SEPARATION OF 20 YRS.
