CAREY IS SORRY HE DID NOT KILL MAYOR WEST TOO

Coroner's Jury Finds Murder of Marshal Was Causeless; Carey Forced Conflict by Taunts and Curses.

(Special to The Journal.) Vale, Ore., May 13.—Jasper Westfall, the murdered marshal of the little town of Westfall, 30 miles west of this city, came to his death by gunshot wounds, inflicted without cause or justification by Asa Carey while Jasper Westfall was performing his duty as police officer of the town of Westfall...

Such was the report of the coroner's inquest held in Westfall Saturday afternoon. Carey is in the county jail here, is stubborn, and still says he is sorry he did not get Mayor William West while he was at the job. Carey's deed was the result of a grudge against Jasper Westfall because the latter was appointed in his place as marshal of Westfall a few days before the gun fight. Carey was appointed marshal about a month ago when Ben Corbett, then marshal, moved away. Carey's appointment was made while Mayor West was out of town and when Mayor West returned home a few days ago he called the coroner and Jasper Westfall marshal.

Wants to Try Rival's Mettle. Bore at the action of the mayor and sore against Westfall, Carey began to drink in order to drown his trouble and falling into company with Arthur P. Pickett, made boasts that the new marshal could not arrest anybody and that they were going to try him out. Carey had a \$2 automatic and Pickett a \$2 Smith & Wesson revolver and the shooting up of the town started, bullets being thrown through the roof of the Jones saloon porch.

The marshal hearing of the trouble, started for the scene. Carey came up, covered Westfall with his revolver, shouting "Get out of here, you scoundrel!" and Westfall tried to arrest him he would kill him. Westfall was not armed, but later returned and hunted up Carey. The scene of trouble then shifted to a saloon where Westfall had gone to look for Carey. Not finding his man he came out on the porch and then spied Carey coming toward the saloon. Carey saw Westfall and walked up to the porch, brandishing his gun, calling the marshal vile names and a coward who was afraid to make an arrest.

Westfall Tried to Arrest. Finally Westfall stepped off the porch and informed Carey he must consider himself under arrest. Backing up a few steps Carey made three, and it was while Marshal Westfall was pulling his gun to cover Carey that Carey also grabbed his gun, Westfall not shooting until Carey had his gun out.

Of the 12 or 15 witnesses few can say who shot first, as the fire was so rapid and close. The marshal fired one shot, grazing Carey's head, while Carey fired three shots, one missing, another breaking Westfall's wrist and the third lodging in Westfall's side. He lived only 45 minutes. Stopping over the dying man, Carey secured his gun and held the crowd of bystanders at bay. He was captured by Deputy Ben Corbett.

Father of New-Born Babe. Westfall was 40 years of age and a man of family. Carey is 33 years of age and his wife had just gotten up from her bed, having given birth to a child only 10 days ago. He has lived in Westfall 10 or 12 years. He is a blacksmith by trade and was considered the ringleader of most of the trouble and shooting up this town has experienced in recent years. Six years ago, while marshal, he shot Frank Camman, but was exonerated upon the plea of self-defense. Three years ago, while in a fight, he so unmercifully beat Dan Brady, 40 years of age, that Brady died a few days later.

Carey will have his hearing today. When The Journal correspondent questioned Carey at the jail this morning, Carey was defiant, changing quickly to his restless and seemingly don't care spirit. Then, dropping into a surly mood, he walked away, muttering that he didn't want to say anything. A few

minutes before Carey had been visited by District Attorney Robert Duncan, who wanted to question him about the hearing to be held Thursday. The man you wish to shoot is not the only one who would give Duncan. Carey was indifferent to all questions and it looks as if he will wait for his hearing.
