It had been the hope of the companies that Italy would submit their claims to The Hague tribunal. The Popolo Romano, however, the official organ of the government, has just announced that the government will not permit this step to be taken, for the reason that the government does not concede that the American companies have suffered any damage.

Bishop Dowling's Jubilee. (Special to The Journal.) Hamilton, Ont., May 21.—A notable public celebration was held today in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the consecration of Bishop T. J. Dowling as head of the Roman Catholic diocese of Hamilton.

The stipulation made by the government that the company could not sell more than 100 acres to any one purchaser and at a price of \$2.50. The company later sold in bulk to the Southern Oregon company, thus breaking the agreement with the government. The land has been tied up by court proceedings since 1909, and it is for the years 1909 and 1910 that the taxes are sought. The decision of Judge Wolverton had no bearing on the main question.
