

Blomberg whatsoever. He can only at-tribute it to the activity of certain officers who have been a disturbing ele-ment in the naval militia, who are ficers, as has been stated, but his relations with them have been the most pleasant and harmonious.

"It is true that Mr. Blomberg has borrowed some money on an expense account covering a trip to Marshfield, but that was entirely regular. He was allowed regular expense money by the state, but on account of the red tape and time necessary to get the money, he simply preferred to borrow on it rather than have to wait. That doesn't enter into the causes for the governor's action at all. "Only a few days ago Mr. Blomberg

paid \$36 out of his own pocket toward some expenses of the Bandon naval militia.
