

VEDRINES TO TAKE TO FLYING AGAIN

"I Am Vaccinated," He Says, His Head Swathed in Bandages.

(Clipped From Leased Wire.) Paris, May 28.—Julius Vedrine, former French aviator, who was thought to have been fatally injured when he fell a month ago, expects to take to the air again shortly, according to his own statement today. His recovery, now nearly complete, is regarded by medical men to be little short of a miracle.

Vedrine has no recollection of how he fell. He says he will fly from Madrid to Paris in one day. It was while attempting this feat that he fell. He expressed himself as not afraid of another accident. "I am vaccinated" he explained, his head still swathed in bandages.

ENGINE DRIVERS ADOPT PLAN FOR AGE PENSIONS

(Clipped From Leased Wire.) Harrisburg, Pa., May 28.—Plans for pensioning totally disabled or retired members were adopted yesterday by the

convention of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers. The pension plan can be taken up or ignored by each different local belonging to the Brotherhood as the various locals see fit. Under the plan every individual member under 30 years old must pay \$5 cents a month for five years toward the pension fund, and thereafter \$1 a month. Those over 30 years old pay \$1 a month for five years, and then \$1.50.

Special Election Called. (Special to The Journal.) Hood River, Or., May 28.—Preparation is being made by the committee appointed

by Governor West to hold an election in Hood River county June 3 for nomination of a candidate for the office of county judge. Governor West has promised the voters that he would appoint the nominee to the office. It is stated that this unprecedented procedure of calling an election when the appointing power is vested in the governor is due to complications that arose relative to the recommendations of the several candidates proposed for the office to the governor. R. W. Stark is the only candidate who has announced himself publicly. Reports are current that G. R. Caster will also be a candidate.

Officer Sent to Guardhouse. (Clipped From Leased Wire.) Geneva, May 28.—The Swissness of Swiss officers for what the newspapers describe as "German army methods," was again discussed when Lieutenant

was sentenced to 30 days' imprisonment in barracks for ordering a corporal to beat a soldier with his sword belt for a minor offense. The corporal got five days and the injured private's friends instituted a damage suit for assault.

RUSHING CONSTRUCTION ON ELECTRIC RAILROAD

(Special to The Journal.) Albany, Or., May 28.—Preparations are being made by the district engineer of the Oregon Electric and his office force for the connecting up of the track from Salem with the track already laid in Albany by tomorrow morning. One of the company's gravel pits near this city has just been reached by the track going that has been working from Salem and the ballasting will be carried on as rapidly as possible. Service between here and Salem can be established by July 1. On account of the nearest station being at Portland, three miles toward Eugene, it will be necessary to complete the track and wiring at least that far before electric service can be had. The franchise in this city prohibits the use of street except in construction or emergency.

Webb Leaves San Diego. (Clipped From Leased Wire.) San Diego, Cal., May 28.—Attorney General U. S. Webb is on his way north today, being called away from San Diego on important business. His report is that the attorney general is bound for San Francisco, another that he will visit Sacramento.
