3000 IN GAMES AT STOCKHOLM

Athletes From All Parts of the World Will Assemble in Stadium.

Stockholm, June 11.—Preparations were completed today for the Olympic games, which will be held here from June 23 to July 12. It is expected that from 40,000 to 50,000 foreigners will visit the Swedish capital during the time.

There are 3000 athletes from all parts of the world entered in the contests which is nearly 1000 more than were present in London in 1904. The stadium in which the contests will be decided is one of the finest in Europe. It is constructed of deep red brick and granite, and flanked by two huge towers of medieval period. It will become the permanent home of Swedish sport.

Theodore Roosevelt will be the only American representative at the opening of the tennis contests. He entered by telegram at the last moment, and his entry was accepted as a compliment to him.

Gibbons Defeats Connors. Philadelphia, June 11.—Mike Gibbons, the St. Paul welterweight, is victor today over Tommy Connors of Brantton, Pa. whom he played with for 10 rounds in Brantton. For eight rounds he contented himself with standing off and jabbing the Pennsylvanian, but in the last two periods he tried for a knockout, and only the bell saved Connors in the tenth.

Phil Jawn Back in Ring. Philadelphia, June 11.—Philadelphia Jack O'Brien will once more enter the ring, according to his own statement here today. O'Brien has accepted the challenge of Ben Koch, a heavyweight from the United States navy, and will battle on Monday evening next before the American Athletic club, which is owned by O'Brien.
