The committee decided that the big events on the Pacific coast to be made the basis of an advertising campaign which will attract visitors here shall be the following:

Honolulu Midwinter Carnival, Manila Carnival, San Diego Fiesta Adelante, Portland Rose Festival, Tacoma Monte Mara Feste, Seattle Golden Potlatch, Bellingham Mount Baker Marathon, Vancouver Carnival and Exposition, and the Panama Pacific International Exposition.
An allegorical figure of a woman pulling aside a curtain which discloses the World's Fair to be held in the Exposition City, San Francisco, in 1915, is the design to be used on all advertising posters and letterheads. Every railroad that operates on the Pacific coast will be asked to publish in its folders a list of the festivals that are held on this side.

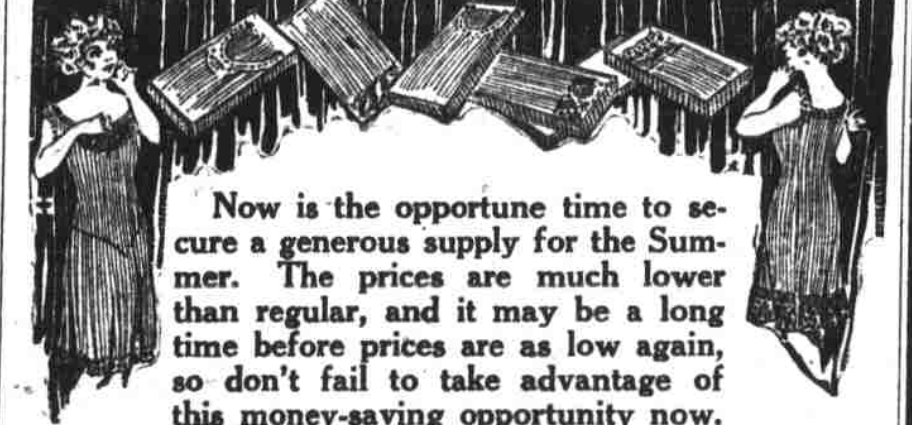
