Rainier, Or., June 19.—The body of Henry C. Kruse, a well-to-do rancher near Scappoose, was brought here this morning. He was killed instantly yesterday while blowing stumps on one of his ranches there. He was standing more than 250 feet from the stump that had been charged with high explosive powder and while endeavoring to dodge one part of the stump that was blown in the air, was hit by another part and instantly killed. That death was instantaneous after the first blow was struck is the theory of the coroner, for there was no evidence of a struggle found. The entire back of the head, however, was completely crushed in. The bridge bolt was taken to the room, it is believed, in a newspaper, in which it was found wrapped. Only one person in the house heard any unusual noise during the night except the 10-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Warpole, who have rooms directly across the hall from where the murder was committed. At the breakfast table this morning before any one had heard of the affair the little boy wanted to know if anyone had been sick during the night. He said that he heard someone groaning, and a few minutes later something fell to the floor with a thud. He said that it had

happened between 2 and 3 o'clock in the morning. It is believed that the murderer, who had carefully planned the affair, walked into the room when the door was opened, hurried in, struck the other over the head, searched his pockets,

then packed the suitcase and fled. The dead man was about 32 years of age, weighed about 125 pounds, and had the build of an athlete. He was rather well dressed, in a probably new cheap suit. There are no marks on the suit to show where it was purchased. An agent at police headquarters was notified, one hour after the body was discovered, due to an inability to reach the police station on the telephone. Captain of Detectives Harty and Detective 2211 and Hays were rushed to the place in the police auto. Later Detectives Vaughn and Litterland were also assigned to the case.
