

CLUB WOMEN GIVE LIBERAL SUM FOR FEDERATION WORK

Delegates to San Francisco Convention Subscribe \$8500 for Endowment Fund; Interesting Addresses Follow.

San Francisco, Cal., June 29.—Within the space of ten minutes this morning the delegates to the General Federation of Women's Club convention, in session at the Butler street pavilion, pledged \$8500 to the endowment fund of the federation thus demonstrating in most practical manner their deep interest in the service which the organization is giving to the country.

This money-raising scene was the most spectacular and enthusiastic that has moved the convention so far. The women could not get the floor fast enough to give their money away. Nearly every state answered the appeal instantly and generously and it is predicted that before the end of endowment fund is closed the \$100,000 goal set by the federation two years ago will be reached.

Delegates Moved to Tears.
This part of the program was in charge of Mrs. Percy V. Pennington, candidate for the new president of the federation. She is chairman of the Field Endowment committee. She made a speech that stirred the delegates to a high pitch of sentiment. Mrs. Philip Carpenter, her rival for the presidency, followed her and increased the enthusiasm. Then Mrs. Sarah Platt Decker of Colorado took the platform and in a few minutes had the delegates laughing and weeping by their descriptions of the work of the federation in the isolated, poverty filled districts and with her plea for the money to carry the gospel of hope to the poor and forsaken.

Outside of the endowment work there were many important features to the program. It was given over to Miss Helen Varick Boswell, chairman of the department of industrial and social conditions.

Important Program Follows.
Mrs. Everett W. Patterson opened the program with the report of the industrial department of which she is chairman. She reviewed the development of her department from 1889 to the present day. It has grown from 24 clubs to 1200.

Miss Boswell in her report cited state legislation for the protection of industrial workers for which the department has stood during the last two years. She mentioned the children's bureau bill, the employers' liability and workmen's compensation bill, the bill to prohibit the use of white phosphorus in the manufacture of matches, the bill to create a national industrial commission and the bill to prohibit contract labor. The department has worked wherever possible for means for the prevention of child labor, the providing of funds for widowed mothers the abolishment of locked doors in factories, fire drills and shorter working hours for women.

Speaks on Household Economics.
Mrs. Olaf N. Guldin spoke on "Household Economics."

"It seems as though the whole country was awakened to the vital necessity for more science along household lines," she said. "It is in intuitive love and it must be expressed in coherent terms. Teaching women how to cook on a three legged stove is only the beginning."

"We must teach her that she is worth a new stove. A good stove is better than a new dress. Then let them adopt standards of dress that endure and many problems will be solved."

Mrs. W. E. Miller of Indiana spoke on the "Social Development of the Working Girl."

PLENTY OF NAMES ON 'MAJORITY' PETITION

W. B. Glafke, who, with Sanderson Reed, has been interested in the circulation of the "majority vote" initiative petition, yesterday stated that 17,500 names have been secured, whereas less than 10,000 are required. This will insure the measure going on the ballot this fall. About 70 laborers were employed outside of Portland.

The purpose of the petition is to require that all measures placed on the ballot by the initiative shall receive a majority of all votes cast at the election to become laws, instead of a mere majority of those voting on any particular measure. Voting by the referendum is not affected.

Yesterday petition circulators were gathered on almost every corner in the downtown section, as the time is close for filing petitions, and many proposed laws and amendments are short of the required number of names. The result was a harvest for the circulators, the price paid for names being in many cases increased from 2 and 3 cents to 5 and even 7 cents. Petitions will have to be checked up and filed not later than July 3 at Salem.

YAKIMA ELKS PREPARE CONVENTION STUNTS

Secretary Varco, who weighs 200 pounds, intended to enter for the prize offered for the heaviest man at the convention until he found that Jake Keffman, of Walla Walla, who weighs 280 pounds, is out for the award.
