Referee Eyton Disqualifies the British Boxer in Ninth Round Against White.

Los Angeles, July 20.—Jack White, the 125 pound boxer of Chicago was awarded the decision over Owen Moran of England on a foul in the ninth round of a slow and uninteresting fight at the Vernon arena this afternoon.

The fight was an unsatisfactory one from the beginning, and when Moran was disqualified by Referee Eyton 3500 boxing enthusiasts went home disgusted with the show.

Round 6—They exchanged rights and lefts. Moran reached the lead with both hands. White jabbed Moran with left to nose.

Round 7—Moran jabbed two lefts to mouth, bringing blood afresh. Moran upped with right to chin. They exchanged lefts.

Round 8—They exchanged lefts and clinched. Moran scored with left to cheek and left to the nose.

Round 9—Both reached nose with lefts. White landed left to head and shot right and left to stomach.

Eastern Experts Favor McLaughlin in Fight for Title Held by Larned.

New York, July 20.—Ranking players are already commencing to discuss the probable outcome of this year's national lawn tennis championship. It is pretty generally felt that there will be a new champion.

In the last 11 years only three Americans, Larned, Wright and Clothier, have won the title. Of these four men one, Larned, has been in the first rank for two decades; the other three have occupied similar positions for at least half that time.

This year the title holder will be obliged to play through the tournament. Could Larned remain at the top of his form through a whole week? Many are positive that he could not.

During the last decade less than half a dozen men have given promise of attaining the championship. McLaughlin, Bundy, Touchard, Long, Niles and Johnson, and only the first two could be seriously considered in this connection.

The present favorite for the title is Maurice F. McLaughlin, the brilliant player from the Pacific coast. Last year McLaughlin was the challenger. He met his first ranking player in Dabney. The latter by aggressive play, succeeded in forcing one set to deuce, though he could not land it.

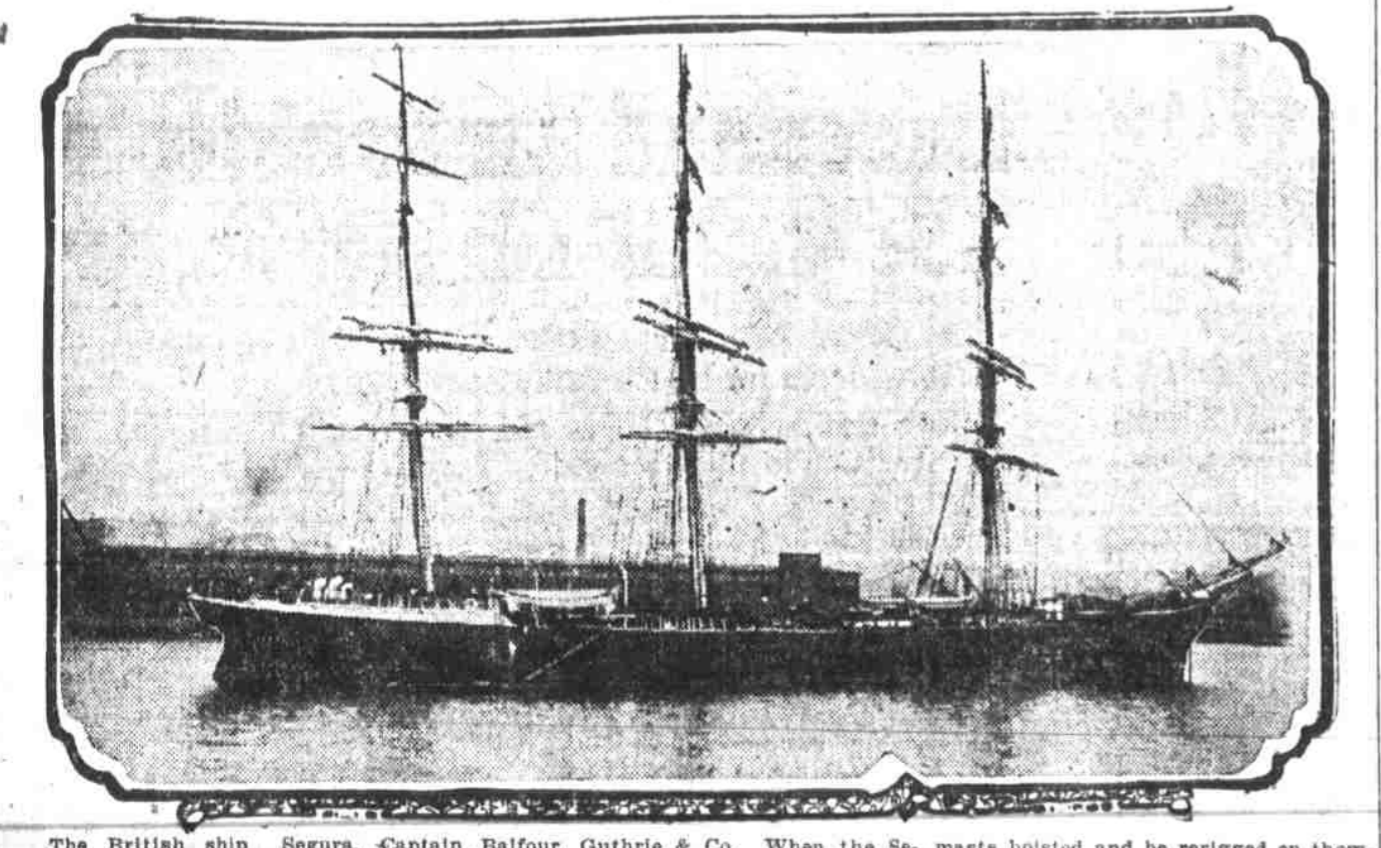
