

"LET 'ER BUCK" TO BE REAL THRILLER

Pendleton Planning for Great Show; 45 Wild Horses Promised.

Plenty of action and thrills are promised at the Pendleton Roundup in September by George Hartman Jr., treasurer of the roundup and assistant cashier of the First National bank of Pendleton, who is in Portland en route to Pendleton after a vacation in the Canadian Rockies. He is accompanied by Mrs. Hartman.

"I could tell many things that the roundup officials contemplate staging this year, but must decline to do so, because it has been our policy to give more than we promised," said Mr. Hartman today.

"We have preparations under way to make the production this fall outside anything that has been accomplished by us thus far. Last year we had a seating capacity of 12,000 and every seat was filled. For this season grand stands capable of seating 3500 additional people are being constructed, in anticipation of larger crowds.

"More cowboys will, in all probability, participate in the show, owing to the fact that \$10,000 will be awarded as prizes in various contests.

"A thorough system of providing quarters for strangers in Pendleton during the progress of the roundup has been inaugurated. A committee is looking after this phase of the work and the people of Pendleton will throw open their homes to those whom the hotels cannot accommodate.

According to information received by Mr. Hartman from Pendleton, George Drumheller, a prominent inland Empire stockman has written that he will bring a string of 45 wild horses into Pendleton for the buckaroos to ride at the roundup. Other stockmen will bring in their wildest steers for use in the production.

Mr. and Mrs. Hartman were in Portland for the Rik's convention, and left immediately for Idaho, in the Canadian Rockies. They have been in Portland several days, the guests of relatives, and will leave for Pendleton tonight. The roundup will be held September 26, 27 and 28.

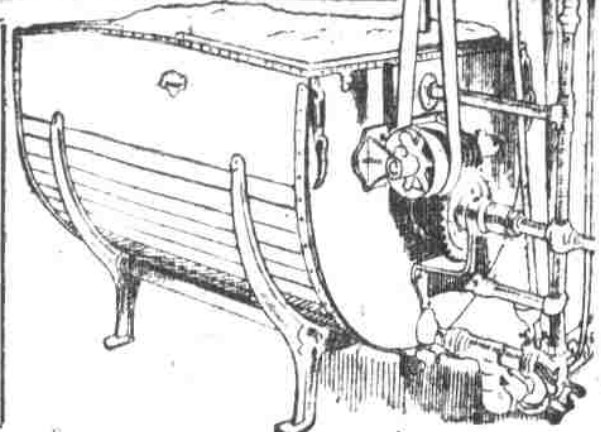
