

KEEPER TELLS HOW MONKEYS SLUMBER

Each Assumes Different Attitude When Asleep, Most of Them Ever Alert.

"When a monkey sleeps he picks out the highest perch he can find," said Keeper Patterson of the Barnum & Bailey menagerie. "When the only home of the monkey was a forest he lived always in dead tree trunks. Once in a while a monkey would climb a tree and a meal for the king of beasts. Although the monkey is a rather wise boy and knows that in a zoo the lions are securely caged, the fear of the lion is born in him, and this accounts for his finding a high perch on which to sleep. The lioness when free from family cares, is prone to lie on its back, with its legs stretched out straight in the air and paws pendant. The lion, when the excitement of the day is gone, stretches itself out flat on its side with paws turned in and twitches and throbs during its slumber a good deal like a dog. Gorillas and chimpanzees sleep with their hands over their heads. Bears, which have no fear, sleep in any position. The same is true of the animals of a cunning or cowardly nature, however, are always on the alert, even when asleep. A seal sleeps like a human being. It stretches out at full length and enters dreamland on its back, stomach or side. Once in a while a seal will sit up with its head bent down on its chest, fast asleep in the water, with its ears under, so as his custom in his native state, that he may hear the approach of an enemy, sound traveling with great distinctness under water. Elephants sleep upright, which exhibits a habit which they are keenly alert to the slightest noise, and quick to sense things. If they can see the object they do not rattle easily, but if it is something weird sounding and out of sight, they need the reassuring voice of their keeper. With the elephant the voice is everything. They have the same feeling for a friendly, sincere voice that a natural musician has for the sound of a musical voice."

The Oregon Law on Advertising

Any person, who in a newspaper or other periodical, or in public advertisement, or by letter or circular, knowingly makes or disseminates any statement or advertisement, the quantity or quality, the value, the merchandise, or the motive or purpose of any article, the method of producing or manufacturing of his merchandise or professional work, which is untrue or calculated to mislead, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than 10 days nor more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. (L. 1909, c. 104, p. 164.)
