The old couple were born and raised together in Naseby, Northamptonshire, England, and were married there in 1852. They lived there until 1873, when they came to Canada, settling in On-

tario. In 1880 they moved to Manitoba and finally in 1881 to the United States where they bought a farm near Salem, Or. Three years ago they came to Newport and have since lived with their son, J. A. Burdette, of Newport. Mr. Burdette was a minister in the Wesleyan Methodist church and was actively engaged in preaching until shortly before coming to Newport. Notwithstanding their advanced age the two old people are still active. Mrs. Burdette, keeping house for her son while her husband works the garden and splits wood in a manner that shames the younger generation.
