

CONSIDER PLANS FOR PUBLIC PARK

Board Holds Conference With Committee of Greater Plans Ass'n.

The park board yesterday afternoon held a special meeting with a special committee from the Greater Portland Plans association. The committee, headed by Howard Everts Wood, asked the board if it was the intention of the board to carry out the Bennett plans for a city beautiful in case the voters passed a charter amendment for a bond issue of \$2,000,000 of park bonds at the coming special election.

In reply Superintendent Mische of the park department and members of the board said that in general the plans of the board are in harmony with the Bennett project, but that the latter would not be followed in every detail. "We intend to purchase about 500 acres of land at a cost of approximately

\$1,500,000," said Superintendent Mische, "and we will spend \$500,000 in improvements. The people demand playgrounds and it will be necessary therefore to select sites in congested districts as far as possible, in order to serve the most people for the least outlay.

BOWERS HOTEL BOUGHT BY WRIGHT & DICKINSON

The Bowers hotel was purchased yesterday by Wright & Dickinson, proprietors of the Oregon hotel, and will be operated hereafter as an American plan hotel. Messrs. Wright & Dickinson acquired the lease and furniture, owned by the Bowers Hotel company. Charles H. Rowley, who has been manager of the hotel for several months, will remain with the hostelry in the same capacity, although the general direction of the house will be under the supervision of the new owners.

SOUTH COTTAGE GROVE EXPERIENCES BAD FIRE

(Special to The Journal.) Cottage Grove, Or., Sept. 20.—The destruction of the entire southern part of the city was narrowly averted in a fire yesterday afternoon in which the Commercial stables and contents, with the exception of the horses; the Burkholder-Woods warehouse and contents; S. R. Piper's residence, and a number of small storehouses were destroyed. The buildings occupied by Knowles & Graber, into which the Simeral & VanDenBerg stock had just been moved, Dew Larzee Bros., Cottage Grove shoe store and the Thompson hotel caught fire several times but were saved by the fire ladders. The Burkholder-Woods company and Rees-Wallace company were thought for a

time to be in danger, and water was thrown on the roofs. The Commercial stables were well filled with hay and burned with intensity. A strong breeze made fighting the flames difficult. As far as can be learned all horses were gotten out of the stables without injury, except one belonging to Burkholder-Woods, which was badly burned about the neck.
