Country advices indicate that there will be a very good crop of strawberries this fall and that quality will be much better than usual.

KEPT BABY MUMMIFIED FOR YEARS IN ROOM

London Workwoman Tells Pathetic Tale of Love and Blackmail.

London, Sept. 21.—Kneeling beside the grave of her baby, the body of Violet Grange, a young working woman 23 years old, was found here today.

The pathetic end of Miss Grange was the sequel to a unique case of mother love brought to life when she was arrested recently for having mummified the body of her infant child, keeping it in her room in the tenement district for four years.

"I couldn't bear to part with the little darling," she pleaded to the magistrate before whom she was arraigned, "so I steeped it in vinegar when it died and had a man treat it."

The informer was sentenced to five years imprisonment, while the woman gained her liberty.
