charter be placed on the special election ballot November 2, it means that he recognizes as law the statute passed since the adoption of the initiative and referendum which requires that the city auditor must place on the ballot any and all initiative measures which the council has ignored or has refused to submit. He strongly indicated Saturday that such would be his decision.

If he says that City Attorney Barbur need not place the Wood short charter on the ballot, it will mean that he recognizes as law that portion of the state constitution which, together with the McNary ordinance, provides that the city may prescribe the manner and form of submitting measures to the vote of

the people, and that in the case of Portland the preferred manner is to have the council say whether measures shall be submitted or not. The position of the Wood charter advocates is that when 15 per cent of the voters have signed an initiative petition to submit Lord and waldo therein decided 'that a measure to the electorate, it must be submitted.
