The assessor of Multnomah county has this year found and assessed personal property to the value of \$4,440,018. Every dollar of this will, under the proposed single tax law, be exempt from taxation.

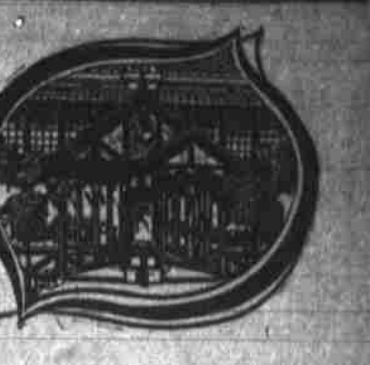
