DUST IN CLEVELAND SHOPS TO BE FOUGHT
Cleveland, Ohio, Nov. 7.—Cleveland is about to embark on the anti dust crusade which promises to eclipse the war waged on flies, the smoke abating battle and even the anti vice crusade which is at present being fought. State Factory Inspectors Peter T. Curley and William Unick are responsible for the dust war declaration. They have asked the local and state boards of health to join them. Shops and factories where dust creating machinery is used will be the enemy. The health boards and inspectors will fight the dust making machines on the ground that they help spread tuberculosis. "Dust creating machinery is one of the most prolific causes of tuberculosis and for this reason the board of health is interested in the work," said Curley. "I do not expect much trouble in getting employers to remove exhaust and blower systems which cause the dust."

Manufacturers throughout Ohio especially, have seen the advisability of safeguarding dangerous machinery, and are cooperating with the workshop and factory inspectors to the extent that accidents caused from emery wheels, exposed gears and flywheels, have been reduced 90 per cent.

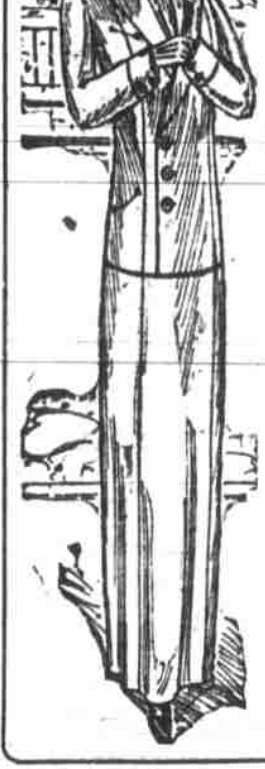
