

ROOSEVELT'S VOTE IN LOS ANGELES IS BIGGER THAN EVER

Early Computations Based on Vote Cast for Unpopular Presidential Elector; Plurality Over 20,000, Is Belief.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Los Angeles, Nov. 8.—Figures compiled by County Clerk Leland today show that Roosevelt's gain in Los Angeles county has piled up a tremendous plurality from the south for the Bull Moose candidate. The figures given out by the county clerk, with but three county precincts missing, are: Roosevelt—City 45,068, county 20,420; total 65,488.
Wilson—City 36,144, county 18,690; total 54,834.
Roosevelt's plurality, 20,654.
Explanation of the mixup in Los Angeles' figures, which kept all the state guessing yesterday, was given here today. It is said that the newspaper computation of Roosevelt's vote was based on the vote given Lieutenant Governor Wallace, one of the presidential electors. Wallace, it is now said, will run far behind the remainder of the Roosevelt electoral ticket, hundreds of voters having scratched his name through dissatisfaction at his recent commination of death sentences imposed on several murderers during Governor Johnson's absence in the east.

Democrat Defeats Progressive.

San Diego, Cal., Nov. 8.—With a plurality of more than 2000, William Kettner, Democrat, has defeated S. C. Evans, Progressive, for congress in the Eleventh district. Evans telegraphed immediately after the election, admitting his defeat.

MANY SALOON LICENSES ARE BEING TRANSFERRED

Indicating that the breweries of the city are hastening to comply with an ordinance which prohibits the running of saloons by powers of attorney after the first of the coming year, was the large number of saloon transfers made yesterday by the liquor license committee of the city council. Each of the 16 transfers recorded presumably means a sale from a brewery to a saloon man of a license. It is said the licenses are bringing \$1800 apiece.
Councilman Maguire announced yesterday that he would introduce a still more drastic amendment to the liquor code than the power of attorney ordinance. Maguire will draft an ordinance making it illegal for a brewer to own more than one retail liquor license.

Wisconsin Selects McGovern.
Milwaukee, Wis., Nov. 8.—President-elect Wilson's plurality in Wisconsin today is placed at 37,000. Governor McGovern is re-elected by 4000 plurality over his nearest opponent.

WILSON HAS SAFE LEAD IN ILLINOIS

Funk, Defeated Bull Moose Candidate, May Run for U. S. Senate.

Chicago, Nov. 8.—Complete unofficial returns compiled here today give Wilson 43,416, Roosevelt 38,561, Taft 255,095. Governor-elect Dunne, Democrat, has a plurality over Densen, Republican, of 110,654.

It is impossible so far to forecast the complexion of the legislature as belated returns are coming in.
Frank Funk, defeated Progressive candidate for governor, may seek the United States senatorship from Illinois. The Progressives hold the balance of power in the legislature.

Kansas Needs Official Count.

Topeka, Kan., Nov. 8.—The election of Arthur Capper, Republican, newspaper publisher, as governor of Kansas, is claimed by a plurality of at least 1000 by Republican leaders here today. The Democrats scoff at this claim, asserting that Hodge has a clear lead of 1500 votes over Capper. It is believed that the official count will be necessary to decide the election.
Wilson's plurality over Roosevelt is placed at 15,000.

Kenyon Sure of Re-election.

Des Moines, Iowa, Nov. 8.—The plurality of Governor-elect Clark, Republican, is placed today at 3400. The remainder of the Republican state ticket is also elected. As the legislature will be Republican, United States Senator William S. Kenyon is sure of re-election. President-elect Wilson has a plurality of 15,000 over Colonel Roosevelt.

Complete Ohio Returns.

Columbus, Nov. 8.—Complete unofficial returns for Ohio on the presidential contest today give the following figures: Wilson 404,321, Taft 272,837, Roosevelt 210,204.
The Socialist candidate polled about 80,000 votes and the candidates of other minor parties about 30,000.

250 FARMERS SAY THEY'LL HAVE NO MORE GRAIN BAGS

Fiat Goes Forth From Representatives of Farmers' Organizations in Convention; Bulk System Demanded.

(Special to The Journal.)
Walla Walla, Wash., Nov. 8.—Grain sacks must go, say representatives of farmers' unions of Washington, Oregon and Idaho, in convention here today for the purpose of solving the sack problem. Practically all of the 250 representatives present are in favor of establishing elevators throughout the northwest, and handling grain in bulk. The amount expended in one year for bags, they say, would establish enough elevators to care for the grain of the northwest as it is handled in practically all other grain belts of this country. They say they cannot continue to pay exorbitant prices for bags, and it is probable that definite steps toward the establishment of elevators will be completed before the convention closes its two days' session, this evening.

Camas, Wash., Goes Dry.
Camas, Wash., Nov. 8.—There are four saloons in Camas that will be closed in 90 days, as a result of the victory for the drys. The vote stood 267, wet 197. Other issues were almost forgotten in the effort to rid the town of saloons.

DEMOCRATS LEAD TAFT IN WYOMING

Wilson Has 500 Plurality; Republicans Claim Re-election of Senator Warren.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Cheyenne, Wyo., Nov. 8.—Latest figures today show President-elect Wilson is leading President Taft by 500, and that the Democratic nominees doubtless will carry the state. The Republicans claim the remaining missing precincts will give the state to Taft but this is not credited. Both sides claim the legislature, but the Republican claim seems to be better supported. Their margin, however, will not be more than four on joint ballot, and later returns may eliminate this.

If the Republicans control the legislature Francisco E. Warren will be re-elected United States senator. The initiative and referendum amendments carried overwhelmingly.

SUIT AGAINST OWNER OF SALEM NEWSPAPER

Salem, Or., Nov. 8.—Legene S. Barnes, one of the new owners who recently purchased the Capital-Journal, is defendant in a suit filed here by A. S. Spencer, in which Spencer asks for personal judgment against Barnes for \$71,625. The complaint alleges that a judgment for this amount was given against Barnes by the superior court of California in Los Angeles county, and, as no part of the judgment has been paid, it is asked that a judgment for this amount be entered in this state.

CHAMPION SOBS WHEN ARRESTED

Jack Johnson Indicted by Federal Grand Jury; Gives Bail; White Slavery Charge.

Chicago, Nov. 8.—The big frame of Jack Johnson, negro heavyweight champion prizefighter, shook with sobs when he appeared before United States Judge K. M. Landis, today, to have approved a \$30,000 bond furnished for him by his mother in a white slavery case. The negro assumed the attitude of a persecuted man, asserting that his enemies were trying "to undermine his character, and bring about his financial ruin." Johnson's arrest followed the returning of a federal grand jury indictment, which charged him with transporting Belle Schreiber, a white woman, from Pittsburgh to Chicago for unlawful purposes. The pugilist's eyes filled when the officers put handcuffs on his wrists. "I am not going to run away," sobbed Jack. "Don't do that. You ought to know better."
"You seem to feel sorry for yourself, don't you?" answered the officer as he locked the bracelets.
Johnson remained in jail several hours before securing his release on bonds.

Judge Landis held Miss Lucille Cameron, the 13-year-old white girl, with whose abduction Johnson is charged, as a material witness against the fighter. Later Judge Landis refused to accept bonds for her release, fearing she would elope with Johnson.
