"Our com-pany recognizes this fact, and we intend that the west shall be well taken care of in a business way. "It is to make arrangements for tak-ing better care of this business, and to promote a big, broad sales policy, that we are now in the west. No part of the country shows greater trade stability than the northwest."

Pleased With Portland. Speaking in particular of the automobile industry, Mr. Gilbert said: "Everything points to another tremenfous year for the automobile business. istimating conservatively, I think there will be probably 750,000 pleasure cars in use in this country next summer. This means that the country will require about 4,500,000 tires. Our company expects to manufacture about onequarter of them. Our factories are running on full summer schedule now, three shifts every day for six days in the
