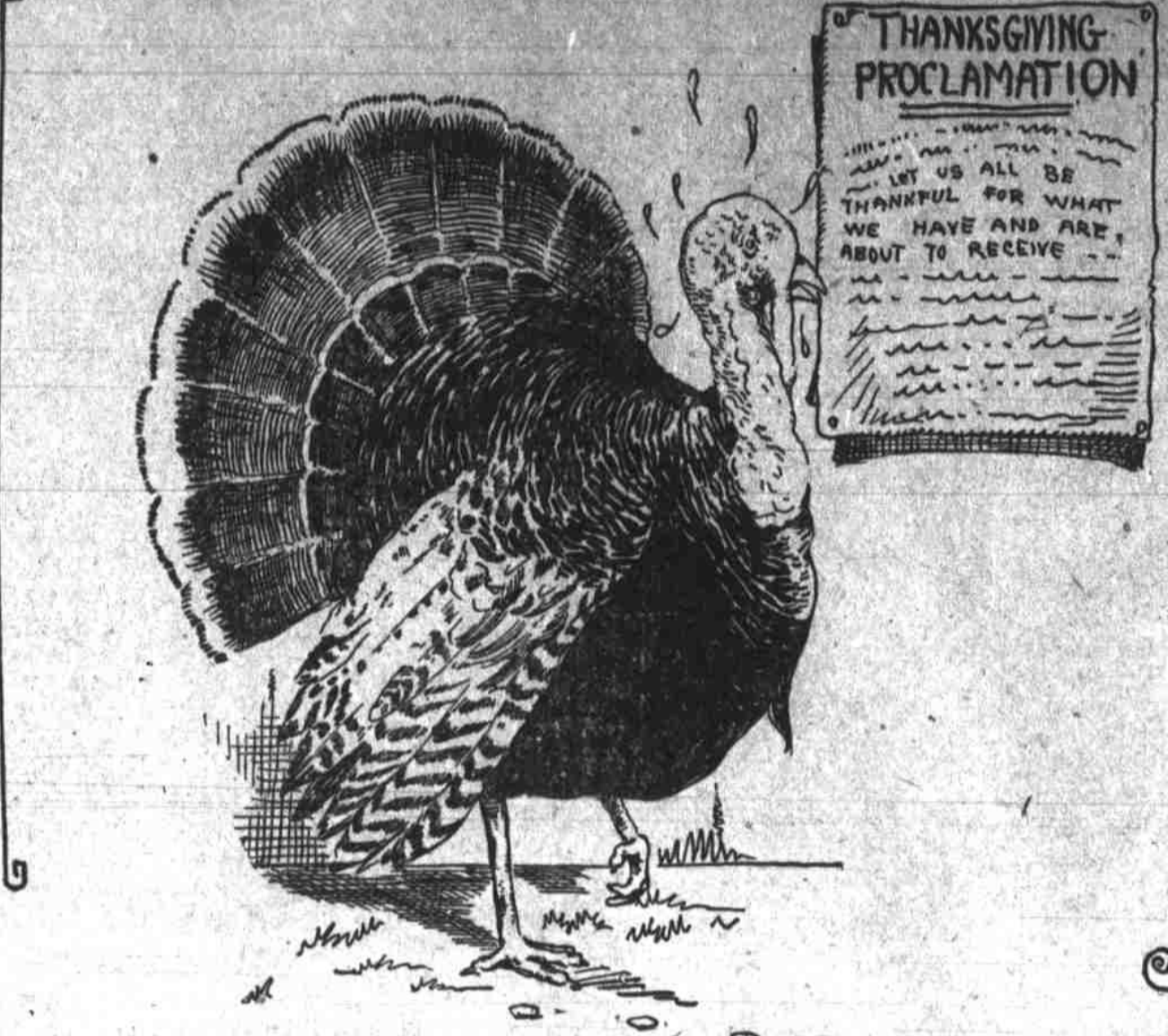
Wool Market Outlook Hopeful Late Buying Shows Good Future
