

STRANDED MEN COMPLAIN TO U. S.

Laborers on Canadian Railroads Say They Were Badly Treated.

(United Press Special Wire.)
Winnipeg, Man., Nov. 28.—On the request of the consul general of the United States here, the Washington authorities have asked for a thorough inquiry into the conditions of the construction camps of Messrs. Foley, Welch and Stewart upon Canadian railway work. It is alleged that some of the United States citizens working for that firm

as laborers have been badly treated; that they were brought into Canada from eastern American points and are now stranded in western Canada between British Columbia and Winnipeg. The disclosures are said to call for immediate action, and the Ottawa authorities have been notified. The accused firm deny anything wrong and say that the complainants are but a small proportion of their employes.

DEER SLAYERS GO TO JAIL FOR HUNDRED DAYS EACH

Albany, Or., Nov. 28.—Two hunters who had been killing deer out of season were brought with their game to this city Wednesday evening and their conviction secured before Judge L. L. Swan. The hunters were Raymond Murphy, aged 17, and T. C. McNeil, aged 26, both of Holley. They were officially charged with the killing of a buck deer out of season, but they had killed four, and the hides of that many

were brought here as evidence of the offense. McNeil was at once fined \$100, but on account of his being a minor, Murphy was turned over to Juvenile Judge J. N. Duncan. Judge Duncan remanded him back to Swan for trial after an examination, and Murphy was then given the same sentence. Neither had the money and accordingly went to jail for 100 days each. The law provides that the informer shall receive one half of the fine, and consequently allows but \$1 per day to a prisoner who serves out his sentence. Murphy's father and uncle were here at the trial of the two offenders, and the father refused to pay his son's fine, as he said he could not spare the money and he had told the boy that he must take the consequences if he were caught.
