

YOUNG BANDIT CONFESSES CRIME

Lad Admits He Was Former
Partner of Youth Caught
Wednesday.

Henry Blomert, 17 years old, was arrested last night, and has confessed to being the holdup partner of Albert Kroll, the 10-year-old lad, captured Wednesday night by F. W. Ingham, 1034 Quimby street, by inviting him home to eat. Blomert has admitted assisting in three crimes.

The youthful highwayman dissolved partnership two weeks ago, when they quarreled over a division of their spoils. Both are now telling the detectives on the other. The stories show a daring course of conduct for boys of this age. Detectives Mallet and Hamersley arrested Blomert last midnight at his home, 389 North Twenty-second street, shortly after he came home. In the municipal court this morning Blomert was turned over to the juvenile court. Kroll is held to the grand jury.

The boys confess to the following holdups:

W. Jacobson and R. T. Tobin, November 5, at Fourteenth and Kearney streets, in which about \$25 was taken.

Richard Syke, November 17, at Fourteenth and Marshall, in which the boys got \$27.

Another crime two weeks ago at Twelfth and Lowry, which was not reported to the police.

Attempted holdup of a man on Sixteenth street Tuesday night. The man ran, supposed to have been J. A. Foulhoux, escaped.

Kroll is the one who held the pistol, while Blomert searched the victims.

About two weeks ago they committed a crime, Blomert taking \$20 from the man's pockets. He turned it over to Kroll, he says, Kroll agreeing to get it changed and give him half.

Kroll's excuse for not dividing the \$20 was that a patrolman arrested him, de-

manding \$15 to let him go free. This story, the detective says, was concocted by Kroll in order to keep all the money. Blomert also charged Kroll with cheating, and they agreed to dissolve the holdup partnership business.

As soon as Kroll was quizzed by the

detectives he told of Blomert. The latter has not worked for several weeks. Kroll has been wanted by the police for stealing bicycles. He lives with his parents at Twenty-second and Roosevelt streets.
