INDICTMENT GIVES A POSSIBLE CLUE IN THE LENOCKER MYSTERY

Edward L. Naylor is Accused of Illegal Friendship for Girl Who Nursed Him.

(Special to The Journal.) Hillsboro, Or., Dec. 21.—Indictments were returned this week by the Washington county grand jury against Edward L. and George P. Naylor, charging a statutory crime. The charge against Edward Naylor is a sequel to conjectures as to his relationship with the young woman who nursed him during his confinement in a Portland hospital after being shot by Frank Lenocker, December 9, 1910. The mystery of the shooting was never completely cleared up. Naylor claims he was shot by a man he met while passing through a grove near his residence on the edge of Forest Grove. Lenocker's body was found near by, he having turned his pistol upon himself after shooting Naylor, and the latter claimed never to have previously seen his assailant. The women named in the indictment is Miss Martha Traver, and at the inquest it developed that she was the first person to reach Naylor after the shooting. Although he claims she was not present when it occurred, efforts to show that Lenocker and Miss Traver were acquainted, and thus establish a motive for the shooting were made at the time, but failed. Naylor was confined to the hospital for many months and was attended by Miss Traver a portion of the time. The indictment is the outcome of charges that since his recovery they have lived as man and wife. The indictment against the brother, George F. Naylor, charges the same offense, the name of the woman being Watrous, well known in Forest Grove. The brothers are well known throughout the state, and are wealthy. Edward was known as a breeder of Angoras, his exhibits winning prizes at many stock shows. They are sons of Thomas J. Naylor, a pioneer of Washington county, who located the Naylor donation land claim. Both were arrested and gave bonds.

IT WAS MAMMA WHO WANTED THE LICENSE

Oregon City, Ore., Dec. 21.—Miss Hatie Hutchinson, the pretty 17 year old telephone operator at the Good Samaritan hospital, Portland, utterly reversed the ethics of marriage license procedure this morning in the county clerk's office. Miss Hutchinson, accompanied by her mother, Mrs. Clara Hutchinson and R. Soper, well-known residents of Canby, Ore., came before Miss Iva Harrington, deputy county clerk. "I want a license," said Mr. Soper. "And your name?" asked Miss Harrington of Miss Hatie. "Oh, it's not for me. I only came to make the affidavit for mama," replied the girl. Whereupon the young telephone operator declared that she was well acquainted with Mr. Soper, that both he and her mama were over 21 years of age. "And you know of no legal impediment to the marriage." "Why of course not," smilingly answered the girl from the Good Samaritan.

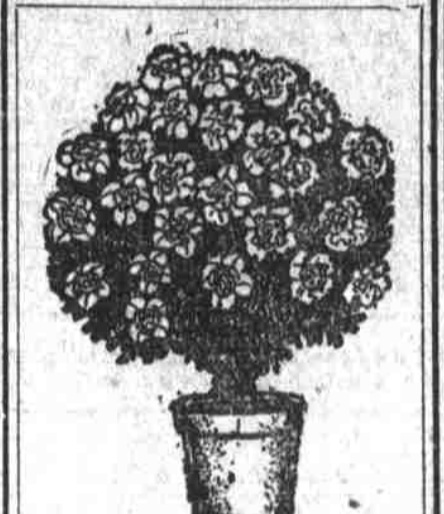

FRESH EGGS DECLINE HEAVILY AS RESULT OF COLD STORAGE STOCK

Drop 12c a Dozen in Last Two Weeks; Hand of Montana Egg King Seen in Change.

The drop in fresh eggs in the Portland market during the last two weeks has been fully 12c a dozen. This is the greatest loss ever shown in the local trade for a like period. Today's wholesale egg prices are the lowest for many years at this period. Sales were being made generally this morning at 22 cents a dozen while 10 days or two weeks ago values ruled around 44 cents. Occasional lots were sold then at 43 cents, the highest mark reached during the year to date. The loss in fresh egg prices here is due entirely to the great quantity of cold storage stock that has been thrown upon the trade by eastern interests. It is said that A. P. Hemmingsen of Butte, who is considered the Egg King of the United States, has dropped several hundred thousand dollars as a result of the decline. Senator Clark of Montana, has been reported the backer of the Hemmingsen company. The price of fresh eggs was placed at an abnormal figure this season by the manipulating influences of cold storage operators who had placed more stock in the local houses than ever before. This price was put so high for all grades of eggs that consumption was greatly curtailed. The speculators over-shot the mark and the result was that at the time when they should have already disposed of most of their holdings, they retained the greatest supplies in years. A sharp break in prices to stimulate demand was the result.
