

WIFE SUES RICH OIL MAN FOR DIVORCE

Parisian Flower Girl, Ward of
Defendant, Adds Piquant
Note to Affair.

(United Press Special Wire.)
Los Angeles, Jan. 29.—A contract covering the presence in America of Mlle. Marie Rita Sultans, 18-year-old Parisian flower girl, who is named by Mrs. Josephine S. Hall in divorce proceedings, is regarded as important evidence in the case.

Hall, who is a millionaire oil magnate, declares that he took Mlle. Sultans under his charge in Paris to educate her. He claims that she has accompanied him in recent travels as his ward.

Mrs. Hall alleges that Hall and the girl posed as uncle and niece at a Tampa, Fla., hotel, and that they are living together in a luxurious home in Los Angeles.

The contract that has entered the case is said to have been drawn between Hall and Mlle. Sultans' mother. Its terms are not revealed, and attorneys blocked efforts to learn whether it contained provisions for monetary exchange.

COUNTY FRUIT GROWERS' INSTITUTE AT ORENCO

Orengo, Or., Jan. 30.—Under the direction of the district horticultural commissioner and county fruit inspector, a county institute will be held in the Sunday school room of the Orengo Presbyterian church next Saturday night. Lewis, horticulturist, will speak on "Horticulture for Small Acreage Tracts, Including Fruit Growing"; Feb. 21, Prof. Ralph D. Jackson, director of extension work, will speak on "Benefits of a Study Club or Visiting the College to the People"; March 7, Professor V. R. Gardner, assistant horticulturist, will speak on "Cultivating, Pruning and Care of the Orchard"; March 21, Professor H. S. Jackson, plant pathologist, will speak on "Fungus Diseases and Remedies"; April 4, A. B. Cordley, dean of Oregon Agricultural College, will speak on "Insect Pests and Remedies, with Special Reference to Lime Sulphur Spray."

SENATOR FACETIOUS AT EXPENSE OF BULL MOOSE

Sacramento, Cal., Jan. 30.—In a resolution introduced in the senate, Senator Stanford proposes that the senate and assembly jointly appoint a committee of three to ascertain all offices not now held by "Bull Moose," and that the committee be instructed to bring in bills abolishing the offices and providing for a commission of five, "at a fat salary" to perform the duties formerly performed by one person. He adds the suggestion that "when all offices are held by the Christian soldiers, who are led by the Lord, the civil service be abolished so that the self-appointed may hold office until the crack of doom."

AURORA MAY HAVE MUTUAL TELEPHONES

A. C. POULTRY FILM IS ON STATE ITINERARY

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., Jan. 30.—The popular poultry instruction moving picture film which the extension division of the Oregon Agricultural College is sending out for a tour of the state is in Woodville today. Professor James Dryden, poultry bandman for the experiment station, left Monday morning for Albany, and at noon started for Cottage Grove, where he was at Roseburg. From Woodville, he will go to Medford, and then to Ashland Friday morning. He returns to Albany on Saturday. On February 13, Professor Dryden is to give the exhibits in the poultry show at Eugene, and will exhibit the film there. He is to be the terminus of the tour into eastern Oregon.
