

SEATTLE TRYING TO GET BRITISH CONSUL

**V. T. Safford of Arrow Line
Camino, Meets Death; Head
Strikes Log and He Disap-
pears in the Water.**

When returning from town to his ship, W. T. Safford, steward on the Ar-

line steamer Camline, was drowned about 11 o'clock last night at Albers dock No. 3. Safford, who was 36 years old, was returning to the Camline with two or three companions last night and was attempting to get aboard the steamer from the lower dock he lost his hold and fell between the ship and the dock, striking his head against a log. He was seen again after hitting the water, but he sank immediately. The harbor patrol was notified of the accident and through Brady, the city grappler, contacted with the harbor force, recovered the body at 11:30 this morning. It was turned over to the coroner.

While in former years there were frequent cases of persons walking off docks or gangways to be injured in a fall and drowned or to be carried away by the swift current, in the past few years, however, cases of this kind have been unusual and where they have occurred have been through some extraordinary cause or through the carelessness of the person falling from the dock.

The Loc made her second trip down the Columbia in that service this morning, as the ice is said to be softening. It is expected that the La Center will be able to resume her regular run between Portland and Lewis river points for the next trip or so.

The word spread around, however, and yesterday it came to the notice of the Portland chamber.

That Portland is the logical location for the consulate has been recognized

for years and there is said to be a little chance for the Seattle boosters to get away with it at this time.

In connection with this the Portland chamber will renew its campaign for the establishment here of a German consulate, as the need of it has been felt here for a long time by the large German population throughout the state.

STORY OF A LOAF OF BREAD

Janet Thoroughly Convinced, my little daughter, tried to make bread last week, and the result was so thoroughly in line with what I have been finding out and telling you, that I really feel I ought to tell you about it.

She has been taking a course in domestic science and has recently been helped by it and quite a cook. She followed her recipe to the letter, and her dough didn't look splendid. I was almost beginning to waver in my own mind. It raised perfectly and she put it into pans to raise. After baking it was not what I had hoped for. I was in the loaf that we found it coarse, tough and full of holes. The reason was simplicity itself. It wasn't the poor girls' fault at all. It was just impossible to get the proper temperature and largely a matter of chance behind an ordinary stove to get bread to raise properly.
