

AMERICANS EARLY ATTRACTED TO DISCOVERY OF "WILKES LAND" NEAR SOUTH POLE VINDICATES EXPLORERS FROM THE UNITED STATES, SAYS GREELEY.

Discovery of "Wilkes Land" Near South Pole Vindicates Explorers From the United States, Says Greeley.

By Major General A. W. Greeley, U.S.A. The news of the finding of new lands sent northward from Professor Mawson's wireless station on Adelle Land will be welcomed by all persons interested in the thrilling story of American polar explorations.

Mawson and his companions have this permanently placed on the maps of the world the disputed areas of Antarctica. This continent was discovered in 1821 by one American sailor, a sealing captain named Palmer, and more fully explored by another sailor, Charles Wilkes, U. S. N., in 1840.

It is gratifying to American explorers that British subjects by their endurance and by their well conducted operations have justified the accuracy and judgment of one of their kin across the seas.

hurt at Walnut Ridge, Ark. Poplar Bluff was almost wiped out. Reports received here late today say that four persons were killed and 20 hurt in a cyclone which swept northern Mississippi early today.

The storm in eastern Arkansas was especially severe, scores of houses being demolished. Three men attempting to cross the St. Francis river were in the water three hours before they were rescued.

Peachtree, La., Is Destroyed. Mobile, Ala., March 21.—Reports that 15 persons were killed in a tornado which practically destroyed Lower Peachtree, La., last night, were confirmed this afternoon.

Buildings Collapse in Detroit. (United Press Leased Wire.) Detroit, Mich., March 21.—One fatality is already reported today in the 80 mile gale which is sweeping this state.

When the gale struck Detroit it took off part of the roof of the unfinished Hotel Charlevoix, caused the collapse of several other buildings and hit the streets with debris.

Damage in Arkansas \$1,000,000. Memphis, Tenn., March 21.—Meagre reports received here today from last night's storm in eastern Arkansas indicate the damage will reach \$1,000,000.

Gale Sweeps Indiana. Indianapolis, March 21.—Reports received here today indicate that every section of Indiana is being swept by a terrific gale.

Ohio Damaged by Storm. Cleveland, Ohio, March 21.—Rocked by a 50 mile gale, Cleveland shivered this afternoon in one of the worst blizzards of the winter.

Lake Tug Is Wrecked. Michigan City, Ind., March 21.—The fishing tug Elsie B., supposed to have been lost in the storm which raged over Lake Michigan last night and early today, was found beached near Michigan City.

Louisiana Town Destroyed. Shreveport, La., March 21.—Five persons were killed and 20 injured last night in a cyclone which destroyed Saline, 50 miles from here, a town with a population of 300.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Douglas, Ariz., March 21.—Women and children are being removed today from Cananea, Sonora, in anticipation of rebel attack.

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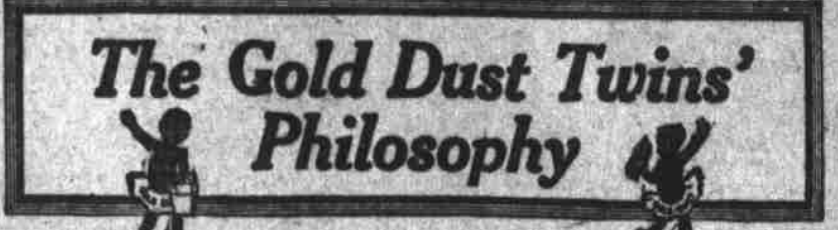
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MOTOR TOPPLES OVER HIGH BANK
