Coroner's Jury Holds Inquest Upon Death of Mrs. O. J. Anderson.

Seattle, March 25.—A coroner's inquest is being held to investigate the death of Mrs. Ida J. Anderson of Stanwood, Wash., who, according to her husband, H. C. Anderson, died from starvation while under the treatment of Dr. L. B. Hazzard, the fast specialist.

MASONIC FEDERATION LOSES POINT AT LAW

A point interesting to fraternal organizations was decided by Circuit Judge Kavanaugh when he overruled a demurrer to the indictment of G. E. M. Somerville, A. J. Court, J. H. Wheeler and J. D. Johnson, who are charged with unlawfully organizing a fraternal organization.

Somerville and the others, it is charged, secured many dupes by starting the "Lodge Alpha Robert Bruce of Portland, Or., of the American Masonic Federation." P. C. Hunt, who was induced to join, was given the understanding that he had become a full-fledged Mason, and that he was entitled to admission to any Masonic lodge.

In British Columbia where there is no law regarding fraternal organizations several months ago recently convicted of obtaining money on false pretenses in the same manner. In San Francisco George E. Holt was given a six months' sentence for obtaining money under false pretenses for similar deals.

DANGEROUS MANIAC IS RETAKEN AT ROSEBURG
