

PROPERTY LOSS IS GREATER THAN AT FIRST SUPPOSED

Supplies Reach Zanesville and Piqua; Every House in the Flooded District Ruined; Big Need Is Clothing.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Columbus, Ohio, March 28.—The streets here are thronged this afternoon with persons seeking missing relatives, but the soldiers refuse to permit them to go to the west side. Governor Cox this afternoon sent a special message to the state legislature, summarizing the loss of life and damage by flood. He said supplies had reached Zanesville and Piqua; that reports of the fatalities had been exaggerated and that every city asking for troops had been reached.

The state has taken over control of the railroads and is using them for relief purposes. Governor Cox this afternoon received the following telegram from George Burba, his private secretary, who is at Dayton: "There will be no further fatalities in Dayton. The property loss is much greater than the first reports indicated. Every house in the flooded district is practically ruined and clothing is badly needed."

Governor Cox this afternoon sent two companies of regular soldiers from the Columbus barracks to quell a panic on the west side caused by sightseers and friends and relatives of missing persons. In a frantic search for relatives and friends, hundreds of persons seriously hampered the work of rescuers and for a time serious trouble was threatened.

The police this afternoon found the body of a man in an alley with an umbrella fastened to his belt.

Mrs. Jones was found helpless in her home by rescuers, and while being rushed to a hospital gave birth to a baby. At the Mount Carmel hospital, several patients are stricken with pneumonia as a result of the flood.

Pardon for Patterson.

Cincinnati, Ohio, March 28.—A movement was started here today for the pardon of John Patterson, of Dayton, president of the National Cash Register company, recently sentenced to a year's imprisonment on a charge of violating the Sherman anti-trust law. Friends of the millionaire believe he is entitled to consideration because of his attitude toward flood victims in Dayton. Patterson has spent thousands of dollars for the relief of sufferers.

Seventeen Dead in Chillicothe.

Chillicothe, Ohio, March 28.—Seventeen are known to be dead here as a result of the flood. Nine of these are identified. Three-fourths of the city was flooded Tuesday. A famine is threatened.

FINE TWO FOR SELLING CIGARETTES TO BOYS

Dealers who persist in selling cigarettes and tobacco to boys are not going to receive consideration at the hands of Justice Jones. Yesterday he assessed a fine of \$25 against a dealer named James and one of \$50 against another named Hansen, for selling cigarettes to boys who were still in short trousers.

James is proprietor of a store at 190 Union avenue, and Hansen at 185 Russell street. George Darlotis, proprietor of a saloon at 36 Fourth street, was held to answer to the grand jury on a charge of selling liquor to a minor. A charge of selling liquor to an Indian was dismissed. Darlotis was arrested by Deputy Constables Hunter and Giel.

MASONS SEND MONEY BEFORE IT IS ASKED

Circulars asking immediate contributions to be used for the relief of Ohio and Indiana flood victims were sent out this afternoon by Grand Secretary J. F. Robinson of A. F. & A. Masons on an order sent from Salem this morning by Grand Master George H. Burnett. In some indefinable way, word of the request spread abroad among Portland Masons even before the circulars were in the press and at this afternoon, only three hours after the first order came, \$500 had been received. The Masonic lodge of Pendleton sent in \$200 yesterday morning. Grand Master Burnett started the ball rolling by accompanying his order this morning with a \$25 subscription.

CHURCHILL IS NAMED STATE SUPERINTENDENT

San Francisco, Cal., March 28.—Frank J. Barry and George V. Myrick of Red Bluff are believed critically injured, and a girl giving the admittedly fictitious name of Miss Athen Monroe of Alameda, is suffering from shock as the result of an automobile smash in Golden Gate park early today. The three were returning to San Francisco after a tour of beach resorts when the chauffeur, Albert Mahan, it is alleged, sent the machine ahead at a mile a minute clip. The chauffeur was ordered to stop by mounted police, who gave chase. Mahan outdistanced his pursuers, but the machine skidded near the park entrance and crashed into a telegraph pole. Myrick, who makes his headquarters in Sacramento, is suffering from concussion of the brain and Barry sustained a fractured skull. Neither is expected to recover.

DOCTORS TAKEN IN MISUSE OF MAILS RAIDS SENTENCED IN FRISCO; WIVES WEEP.

San Francisco, March 28.—Pathos and hysteria marked the sentencing of Dr. L. Lampert of Sacramento and Frank Glando of San Francisco by Judge Van Fleet in the United States district court here today. Lampert was tried and found guilty of misusing the mails, and Glando pleaded guilty to a similar charge. Both were taken in the nationwide raid on "quacks" made several months ago by federal agents.

Lampert was sentenced to pay a fine of \$250 and to six months' confinement in the county jail at Sacramento. Glando was sentenced to pay a fine of \$500. As Lampert stood before the court to receive his sentence, his attorney pleaded for leniency, while tears filled the eyes of the defendant. It was explained that Lampert is poverty-stricken and that his wife will be without means of support for herself and children while he is in jail. As the plea was made Mrs. Lampert was heard sobbing in the rear of the court room.

TENNIS CHAMPION IN TROUBLE OVER A GIRL
