

CATHOLIC CHURCH NOT OPPOSED TO SUFFRAGE CAUSE

Mrs. Belmont Has Found It Sympathetic; Cardinal Gibbons Doesn't Like Suffrage and Says So.

New York, April 25.—Mrs. O. H. P. Belmont today is en route for Europe to attend the National Woman Suffrage convention in Budapest, but in the midst of her preparations she prepared a statement for the United Press taking issue with Miss Inez Milholland as to the opposition of the Catholic church toward equal rights for women. Mrs. Belmont quoted Archbishop Keane as favoring equal suffrage.

My observation is that the Roman Catholic church has put itself on record as being opposed to woman suffrage, but distinctly emphasizes the fact that its attitude is entirely neutral. The Catholic church, like the churches of every other denomination, stands for conservatism, but the wildest imagination could not claim this to be any more a peculiarity of one church than another.

From the standpoint of religion, the Catholic church, and all other churches, leave the question of woman suffrage absolutely alone, and it is unjust and unfair to criticize any church on the ground that some of its members and leaders, as individuals, oppose the principle. In this connection, it is interesting to know that today the Catholic Woman Suffrage association held a public meeting in one of the largest Catholic churches in New York, at the invitation of the pastor.

Gibbons Opposes Suffrage.
While it is true that Cardinal Gibbons, a most conservative man, quite frankly announces the question of woman suffrage, on the other hand the late Cardinal Moran of Australia, having the advantage of observing its beneficial effects in his own country during a period of 13 years, upheld it on all occasions, his words remark on the subject being: "The woman who thinks she is making herself unwomanly by voting is a silly creature."

While the bishop of New York may be opposed to suffrage, the bishop of California is in favor of it. Archbishop Keane sends the following message: "From my large experience as a bishop of the Catholic church in Wyoming, where we have had woman suffrage for 42 years, I have never known but one woman who made herself obnoxious in politics. As to the Catholic women in my diocese, I do not think that the right of suffrage has drawn them either out of their homes or out of the church. I think there need be no fear of that result."

Priests Favor It in California.
In California some of the most active workers for woman suffrage were Catholic priests. Incidentally it might be mentioned that the president of the Church League for Woman Suffrage, which did such effective work in California during the suffrage campaign, was a prominent member of the Catholic church. Rev. Joseph H. McMahon, a New York priest, sums up the attitude of his church on the subject by saying: "Frankly, I don't see why the whole matter has not been settled long since by St. Paul when he declared there was

neither Jew nor Gentile, bond or free, male or female."
Mrs. Belmont will stop in London on her way to Budapest and leave a check for several hundred pounds with Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the English militant leader.
This was promised at a recent meeting in London when \$75,000 was raised. In Paris, Mrs. Belmont will spend some time with Miss Christabel Pankhurst. In an interview, Mrs. Belmont predicted that militant methods might have to be adopted in this country before the ballot is gained.
"Men have never won their freedom without shedding blood," she said, "and women will not get theirs without fighting."

BARKEEPER USES BEER GLASS ON PATRON'S FACE

Service will be inaugurated on the Oryville-Wenatchee extension of the Great Northern by November 1, according to Chief Engineer Ralph Budd, who is now in the city after having made a thorough inspection of the project. The work is being done by Guthrie & Mac-

Dougall, contractors of this city, and 20 miles of track has already been laid. The road will be 125 miles in length and will connect with the Great Northern main line at Wenatchee. It will serve a well developed country and will form an important feeder to the system.

Mr. Budd, who arrived here yesterday with President Carl R. Gray and other officials of the Great Northern, will leave for St. Paul this evening, accompanied by his family. President Gray will remain till Sunday evening.
