

UNSPIKED TIES CAUSE OF WRECK?

Lives Lost in N. P. Smash at Lakeview Number Four; Injured, Seven.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Tacoma, Wash., May 13.—Despite denials by railway officials, employees and others declare today that the absence of spikes to hold the rails firmly in place was the probable cause of the derailment of Oregon-Washington local passenger train No. 362 near Lakeview yesterday, in which four persons lost their lives and seven others were injured. Workmen were engaged in repairing and re-spikeing the tracks at the place where the wreck occurred. About 25 new ties in the 100 feet just back of where the engine left the track were without spikes, but they were interspersed between old ties that were spiked down.

OREGON RANCHER'S WEAPON IS DEADLY

Herbert Ingalls, Clatsop County, Fatally Hurts Ex-Wife, Kills Her Husband, Self.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Seattle, Wash., May 13.—No hope is held out at the city hospital for Mrs. Lucy Osgood, who was fatally wounded by her divorced husband, Herbert C. Ingalls, who then shot and killed her second husband, Dr. L. Osgood, and committed suicide last night. Both men died instantly. The woman was able to make a dying statement to Frank Roberts and James C. Palmer, neighbors attracted by the shots. Dr. P. C. Irwin was summoned, and the woman removed to the hospital.

According to Mrs. Osgood, Ingalls, a ranchman on the Lewis and Clark river, Clatsop county, Oregon, and she were divorced three years ago. Two years ago she married Osgood, a timber land owner in Washington, Oregon and Alaska. Ingalls had been sending threatening letters to her. He came to her house late Monday evening and opened fire without a word.
