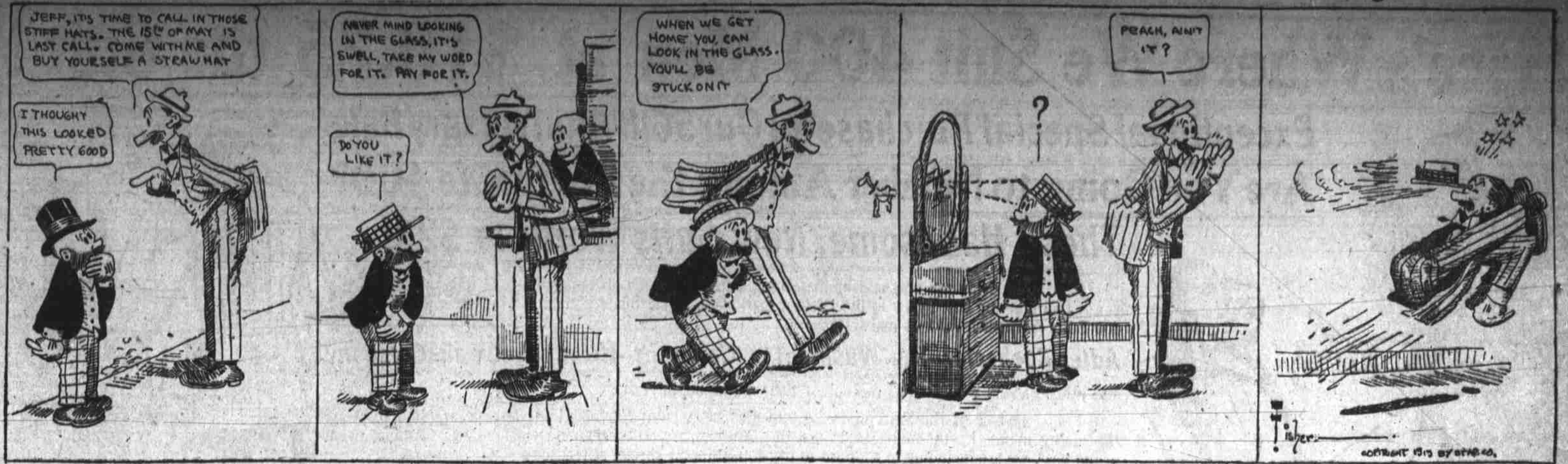

## Brief Items of Tuesday's Late News

Short Stories of World Happenings Not Received in Time for Yesterday's Issue of The Journal.

### Political.

Senator Poindexter has held up the nomination of Edgar Battle as postmaster for Seattle. This action was urged by Democratic senators in the state of Washington who claim that Battle was an anti-Wilson man last year; that he is not prominent politically and deserves no reward. Battle was appointed by the president on the sole recommendation of the postmaster general.

Governor Ross of Massachusetts has approved a bill which prohibits the carrying in parades of any flags except national or state emblems and the flags of friendly nations. Bearing signs or inscriptions opposed to organized government or are sacrilegious or derogatory to public morals, is also prohibited.

A combination of big business is opposing government construction of railroads in Alaska, according to charges made before the senate territories committee at Washington by Delegate Wickersham of Alaska. The Copper River & Northwestern, the White Pass & Yukon railway, the Alaska Steamship company, the Pacific Coast Steamship company and the Controller Bay Navigation company, Wickersham said, were members of the opposing syndicate. "The hands of J. P. Morgan & Co. and the Guggenheims," Wickersham added, "are to be seen in every move connected with Alaska."

By a vote of 45 to 25 the senate has referred to the finance committee the Penrose resolution demanding the names and testimony of persons appearing before the committee regarding the tariff bill.

President Wilson has named Harry J. Kelley to be receiver of the land office at Lewistown, Mont., and Abraham Hogleland to be receiver of public money at Lewistown, Mont. The nominations have been sent to the senate.

The prospective fight over the confirmation of W. J. Harris of Georgia to be director of the census has been submitted to arbitration in the senate. An agreement was reached to vote on the appointment June 25, and Republican senators who had primed themselves with ammunition were disappointed.

The National Manufacturers' association in session at Detroit agreed to send resolutions to President Wilson protesting against the sundry civil service appropriation bill, and urging the president to veto it because of the provision against using its funds for the prosecution of labor organizations under the Sherman act.

In the suit at New York to dissolve the United States steel corporation, Charles M. Schwab admitted the dealings of the Carnegie company with certain "pools" when he served as president of that concern. He testified that it received \$100,000 for staying out of the girder steel market for one year.

Search for a feld which outraged and strangled to death Grace Johnson, a pretty 14-year-old girl of Trafford, near Pittsburg, Pa., is on throughout all the adjacent county, police, state mounted constabulary and sheriff's posse with bloodhounds aiding in the search. The girl left her home to walk two miles to school. When she failed to return her father started search. "The girl's body was found in some bushes by the roadside. She was cold in death and torn clothing and other evidences showed that before being choked to death she had been cruelly outraged."

Threats to spread the waterfront strike to the Port of New York and eventually to all Atlantic coast points were voiced at Philadelphia by leaders of the Industrial Workers of the World. More than 3000 men who demand 25 cents an hour for 16 hours work, time and a half for work after 6 p. m., double time for work on Sundays and holidays and recognition of the union, are out at Philadelphia.

A delegation of 100 leading Philadelphia citizens, headed by Mayor Blankenburg, are on their way to the University of Wisconsin to take a three days' course in advanced municipal government. They will be joined at Chicago by the mayor of Pittsburg and similar delegations from Boston and New York, together with the heads of many educational institutions who want to study the "Wisconsin idea" at close range.

Colonel D. D. Galliard, engineer in charge of the Culebra district of the Panama canal zone, has arrived at Washington, and declares his belief that the Cucaracha slide will be entirely removed by the end of the year. This is the greatest of the earth movements in the famous Culebra cut, and has caused much trouble.

Fire at Stout Falls, S. D., gutted the building and destroyed the stock of the Brown Wholesale Drug company, causing a loss of \$150,000.

## PAVING CONTRACT LET WITHOUT ROW

### Expected Injunction Has Not Materialized. Yet at Sheridan.

Sheridan, Or., May 21.—The Sheridan city council Monday night entered into a contract with the Warren Construction company for the laying of 17,000 square yards of bitulithic paving. Work will begin in ten days. The contract awarded covers properly lying north of the Yamhill river, only. The council now has proceedings well under way for the placing of 20,000 square yards more of the same paving, south of the river. Those property owners who looked that every effort on the part of the city to improve the streets was being made at the last moment and no action was taken by them to stop proceedings. No further trouble is anticipated and negotiations will be hurried in order to insure completion of the work laid out for this year. The plans and specifications as now submitted include hard surfacing, grading, sewers, curbs and concrete sidewalks, including all of Sheridan's main business and residence thoroughfares.

Fire at Enterprise destroyed the Commercial hotel, a three-story frame building, and caused a loss of \$10,000, partially covered by \$5000 insurance. All the occupants, 20 in number, escaped, although some of them had a jump from second-story windows. A Chinese cook carried an alarm clock from room to room to arouse the sleepers.

Appraisers have estimated that it will cost the town of Milwaukie \$11,217 to complete the contemplated purchase of the two private waterworks systems there. The council will negotiate for the Minthorn springs property to furnish the water supply.

A gala occasion will be made of the G. A. R. encampment June 17, 18 and 19 at Newberg. Combined with it will be the annual rose festival and also Fourth of July features.

Roméo H. Stephens has been given an indefinite suspension of franchise from the town of Salem. Judge Campbell of Hillsboro. Stephens robbed the Tuatini station while working as an agent of the Oregon Electric. C. H. Martin, yegman who robbed a jewelry store of 50 watches, got from one to seven years.

President Campbell of the University of Oregon will give an address May 29 at Ashland on the annual commencement day of the Ashland schools. The baccalaureate sermon will be given May 25 by Rev. N. L. Browning of the Christian church.

Foreign.

Dispatches received at Paris from a Vienna news agency declared that Rasad Pasha, the Turkish commander who sought the sovereignty of Albania, has been assassinated by followers of Risa the veridict of the coroner's jury.

Four pouches of letters and 12 sacks of second class mail were destroyed in a fire at Merced, Cal., which damaged the Santa Fe freight sheds and baggage room to the extent of \$10,000. Defective wiring is believed to have started the fire.
