

COMPROMISE FIXES WIRELESS STRIKE

**Union Not Recognized, but
Members Will Not Be Dis-
criminated Against.**

San Francisco, June 1.—The strike of the wireless operators against the Marconi Wireless company has been settled and the men have reported for work. The settlement was a compromise. The union is not recognized but all strikers are reinstated, and conditions are bettered. The wage increase demanded was not granted.

The strikers were instructed by international President S. J. Koenigskamp to "refuse to work" where there is no recognition of the union, there is no agreement that union men will not be discriminated against. The company promised to reinstate the operators as fast as vessels reach ports where they are stationed.

"The settlement is not a victory; neither is it defeat," said Koenigskamp. "Conditions must be better to effect a

It was distinctly understood that the operators have the right to join the union and the company agreed to receive and to treat with grievance committees, despite the fact that recognition of the union as a whole was not accorded. The matter of promotions on the basis of ability and seniority was adjusted.

The company promised to put into effect rules which will protect the men from summary dismissal without a hearing, and in case of dismissal, for reconsideration of the case.

Seattle, Wash., June 7.—"Cal" Buckner, aged 78, a veteran of the Civil war, wants the doctors to cut off the rest of his right leg, following a fall which

caused him to fracture the bone in the stub that remains. "That leg is a hoo-doo, he said. "I got a minie ball through it in the war, and after suffering with it for 50 years, had it cut off just above the knee last year. Yesterday my crutch slipped and here I am in the hospital again."

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
