Thursday's News Briefly Sketched

Happenings of Human Interest Occurring Throughout the World After Yesterday's Issue Went to Press.

Political.

It is announced at Washington that Meredith Nicholson, Indiana novelist, will likely be appointed minister to Portugal, although some protests against him have been made by Indiana Democrats. Colonel Thomas H. Birch, of New Jersey, is said to be awaiting the acceptance of an appointment as minister to Persia.

A favorable report on the nomination of Herman W. Craven, of Seattle, to civil service commissioner, has been ordered at Washington by the senate committee on civil service.

A state dinner was given by Secretary Bryan to Dr. Lauro Muller, special ambassador from Brazil, and closed a busy day of eighteenth at the capital, which included a visit to the government plant where 14-inch guns are manufactured.

Unless the Democratic caucus of the house, to be held June 15, decrees otherwise, the commerce court will be continued until the next session of congress, although no appropriation for its support has been made for the coming fiscal year. This program was agreed on at a conference.

In an interview at Minneapolis Judge C. B. Elliott condemned the Seattle plan for the sale of the Philippine islands to Japan. “Selling the islands would be virtually selling the inhabitants,” he said. Elliott was recently appointed commissioner of commerce and police in the Philippines.

Everett C. Benton, of Belmont, has formally announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for governor of Massachusetts.

President Wilson has informed Colonel Goethals that he will visit the Panama canal as soon as congress adjourns. The colonel said he expected to be in the water in about October 1, but could hold it out two weeks longer in the event that the president was delayed, as he wanted Wilson to see the empty canal.

Eastern.
Mrs. Arthur Keller has confessed at Harrisville, Mo., that she killed her husband, a railroad laborer, and 7-year-old daughter Margaret last Tuesday with an ax as they lay asleep in their beds. She declared to the coroner that she had frequently been irresponsible for her actions.

Near Phoenix, Ariz., Glen Cullen was carried over a precipice by a runaway horse, and escaped with slight injuries by landing on a projecting crag after a fall of 80 feet. The horse was dashed to death.

Attacus, co-defendant with Wood in the dynamite planting case at Boston, has been set at liberty. The jury having returned a disagreement as to Attacus, the district attorney nolle prossed the case.

In the government's dissolution suit at New York, Judge Elbert H. Gary testified that “substantial competition” existed between the Carnegie and Federal Steel companies at the time they were acquired by the United States Steel corporation.

While attempting to arrest an escaped convict at Canon City, Col., John B. Russell, captain of the night guards, was shot and instantly killed by the fugitive, who died later from wounds previously inflicted by Russell.

Counsel for Jack Johnson, at Chicago, has been granted five days to prepare a writ of error to bring the negro's case before the United States court of appeals.

An extreme decline of 30 points was registered at Chicago in the stock of the Quaker Oats company, following the government's anti-trust suit against that corporation.

Reports from “Winnipeg, Man., say that crops in Manitoba and Saskatchewan are drying up under an intense heat wave, reaching at many points to 103 and 105 degrees.

When the second section of a train on the New York, New Haven & Hartford railroad ran into the first section near Stamford, Conn., three passengers were killed and a score injured. Some of the latter may die.

On the investigation of a reported attempt to bribe Juror Shuman in the Wood dynamite planting case, the grand jury at Boston has reported that no evidence was found sufficient to warrant an indictment.

Three automobile bandits at Chicago bound a bartender, held him up with a knife and shot him, and then fled in a store room. They then leisurely robbed the saloon of Arthur R. Schmidt and escaped in a touring car with \$15,000 in cash and \$40 worth of liquor and cigars.

The panes of hunger forced 1200 railroad construction camp laborers at Salt Lake City to return to work, after failing to win their strike. They slept in the open and were without food for 48 hours. One hundred and sixty others, including 60 I. W. W. organizers, were reported.

Pacific Coast.
G. M. Stramont of Pomona, Cal., has been elected commander of the California and Nevada department of the G. A. R.

Five section hands of the Salt Lake railroad have been arrested at Los Angeles, charged with the murder of Purfido Champo. His mangled body was found on the railroad track with 20 bullet wounds in his chest.

While riding on a motor speeder near Midway, B. C., with his wife and baby, J. M. Davidson, agent at Midway, encountered an approaching engine. His wife was fatally injured and his own arm was severed close to the shoulder. The baby was merely shaken and bruised.

Patrolman J. M. Beach shot and probably fatally wounded an infuriated Greek named Sarkis Bagdasarian, who had been ejected from a lodging house at San Francisco. Beach shot the Greek when the latter struck him with an iron pipe.

According to reports received at Lewiston, Idaho, Forest Ranger and James Harkwell were drowned in the Salmon river while trying to cross the turbulent stream on a small improvised raft. They were prominent farmers and stockmen.

Miss Nettie Amelia Snyder received

her diploma at the graduating exercises of the college of music of Willamette university at Salem, Or., being the only member of the class. The college has a large enrollment, but a number of pupils were unable to complete their work this year.

While digging clams near Bay City, Or., Will Spaulding and T. T. Terry of Tillamook became so interested that they failed to notice the tide, which picked up their boat and carried it away. They were in a dangerous predicament when rescued by a passing boat.

Henry W. Sewells, 23 years old, has been arrested at Los Angeles on an indictment returned in New York. He is charged with netting \$75,000 from young men whom he robbed while showing them the sights of New York.

It was announced by Judge Robert S. Hudsoph of New Jersey upon his arrival in Los Angeles that Mrs. Woodrow Wilson and her daughter, and perhaps the president himself, will come to California within the next few months. Miss Jessie Wilson will likely be delegated to handle the trowel when the cornerstone of the New Jersey building is laid at San Francisco.

Dr. L. P. McCalla, a Boise physician, was elected president of the International Good Roads association, whose meeting has just closed at Boise, Idaho. Butte, Mont., was selected as the meeting place for 1914.

Foreign.
London reports that fresh parliamentary sessions may soon arise in England. Scandals are brewing which connect members of the British government with speculations in oil, resembling those which occurred in Mexico.

The minister of agriculture has announced at Buenos Ayres that the American meat packing companies operating in Argentina are not considered a trust by that government.

Actuated, it is said, by a sheer lack of interest in life, Eugene Magg and his wife committed suicide by turning on ‘he gas, at Zurich, Switzerland. Magg was 41 and his wife 35 years old. Their joint estates are estimated to be worth \$10,000,000, and they are said to have been the richest persons in Switzerland.

May Yohe will return to the stage June 16 in London, and will sing her famous song, “Honey Mahoney.”

Miscellaneous.
Patrick T. Quinn, an authority on agriculture, died at the age of 75 at his home in New York. He was credited with having introduced the American cranberry into England.

In an address before the International Association of Police Chiefs at Washington, C. E. Sebastian, chief of the Los Angeles police, advocated woman suffrage as a means of lessening crime.

He declared that crime had been materially reduced in Los Angeles through suffrage recognition of police women.

Two women and two men, alleged heads of the “vice trust” in New York, have been indicted, but it is feared that they have fled to Europe. They are accused of maintaining a long chain of disorderly houses.

The principal address at the graduation exercises of West Point military academy was given by Secretary of War Garrison. He warned the graduates that they must always give proper consideration to enlisted men.

STATEMENTS MUST BE FILED WITH CITY AUDITOR

Salem, Or., June 13.—Secretary of State Olcott today received from T. A. Linthicum, treasurer of the People's Rights league of Portland, a statement showing the receipts and expenditures of \$2341.90 used in connection with the recent municipal campaign, and refused to accept it for filing. Attorney General Crawford advised Olcott that the corrupt practices act provides that such statements must be filed with the city auditor when the election is a city affair. If they are not filed with the city auditor it is the duty of that official to notify the district attorney.

mountain guns, finally drove the tribesmen from their position. The Moro loss is not known, but it is reported that the outlaw leader, and others, were killed.

General James Franklin Bell, division commander of the Philippines, cabled that Major George Shaw commanded the right wing, including the eighth infantry, and the fortieth company of Philippine scouts. Captain Nicholas, with his mountain guns, commanded the left wing.

The fight, cabled General Bell, “was incidental to the disarmament policy of the governor general of the Moro islands. It came after months of fruitless negotiations and promises disregarded by the Moros.”

“Then a situation arose that left no other alternative than war. Amul, with a relatively small following, occupied one section of the island and was the only Moro who refused to surrender his arms peacefully. The Moros themselves generally desired disarmament. Under the circumstances it was impossible and unjust to disarm some of the Moros and to permit others to retain their arms.”
