

\$8000 IS GIVEN PACIFIC COLLEGE

Oregon Yearly Meeting Raises
an Average of \$20 to the
Member.

Newberg, Or., June 18.—Giving with generous hand marked the twenty-first session of the Oregon Yearly meeting of the Friends' church at Newberg. With less than 2500 members, men, women and children, the subscriptions totaled more than \$10,000 aside from the regular appropriations.

Pacific college was given \$8000 in subscriptions toward the running expenses and deficit. The meeting became responsible for \$50,000 of the \$100,000 that is being raised for the college, and the income from the endowment will be available this year. The sum of \$500 was raised for the building of a parsonage at Gulltown, Wash., and it was recommended that the final committee appropriate \$200 for the Greenleaf academy at Greenleaf, Idaho.

CAPTAIN ISAACS DIES AT HOME IN HELIX, OR.

Isaacs, one of the best known pilots of the United States, a veteran of the Civil war, a Mason of long standing and for years postmaster of Helix, died early yesterday morning at his home in Helix following his third stroke of paralysis. He was aged 78 years. He is survived by two sons, James and Will Isaacs of this county, four daughters, Mrs. Emma Perham and Mrs. Edith Harrison of Seattle, Mrs. Mary Sullivan of Long Beach, and Mrs. Agnes Kinsey of Los Angeles. Two brothers, Charles and Aaron Isaacs, are also pioneers of this county and a third brother, William Isaacs, is a resident of Caldwell, Idaho.

MOGUL PLOWS THIRTY ACRES DAILY

Condon, Or., June 18.—Plowing 30 acres per day at an approximate cost of 50 cents per acre is the record made here by Fred Harrison with his big In-

ternational Mogul. Mr. Harrison has been plowing just west of town, and many people have been out to see the outfit work. The engine is a 45 horsepower Mogul, which pulls nine 14 inch

plows with ease. Fifty gallons of distillate are used each day on the average, and two gallons of machine oil. It takes two men to handle the outfit, one on the engine and the other to run the plows.

75,000 CHEER QUEENS OF INLAND EMPIRE

Spokane, Wash., June 18.—"The riches of an Empire" never were more beautifully portrayed than in the Inland Empire industrial parade of the Pow Wow yesterday.

Thirty-three cities and towns had floats and princesses, and 25 of the communities were represented by bands. The pageant throughout was a profusion of colors and was comprehensive in its showing of Inland Empire resources, from the cherries of Clarkston and the grapes of Attalia to the wheat of Garfield and the apples of Wenatchee.

It is estimated that fully 75,000 persons witnessed the pageant, which tra-

versed the four principal avenues of the business district.

Each section was accorded a continuous round of applause.

Every Inland Empire princess was cheered every minute of the 40-block line of march, and the Pow Wow regalia were kept busy bowing and smiling.

While every day at the Pow Wow is Inland Empire day, yesterday belonged to the visitors alone, and they held the center of the stage from 10:30 in the morning until late at night.

In the morning 25 bands from as many towns participated in a novel musical tournament on the downtown streets. Every band played from three to five minutes at each of seven stations.

The afternoon parade was led by Raymond E. Bigelow as Big Chief I of the Pow Wow, and by Miss Spokane.

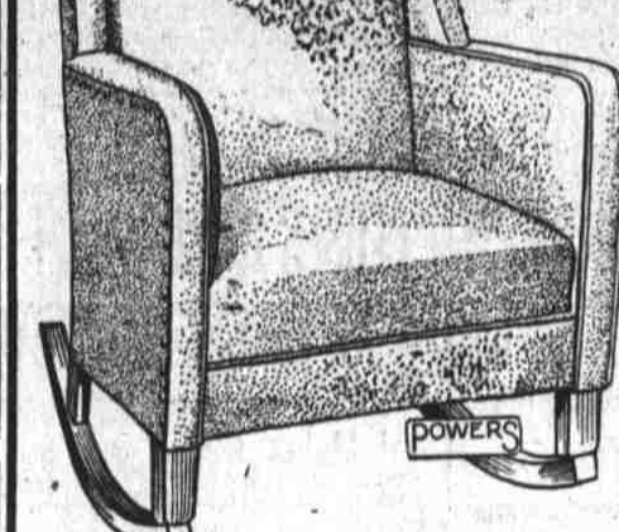

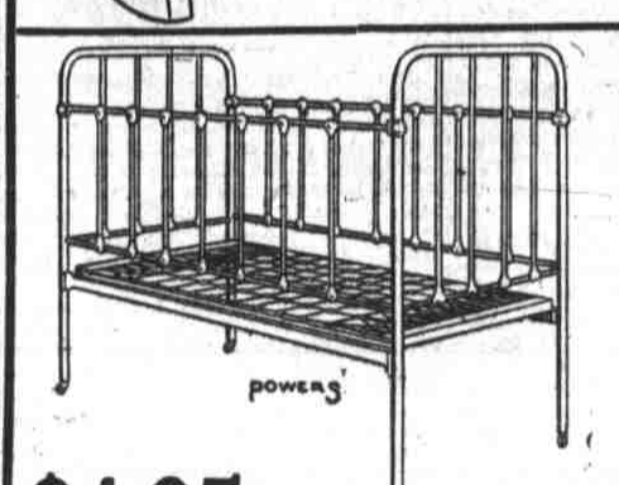
