

WAR VETERANS IN ELECT SKIRMISH

A. B. Stuart Protests Re-election of Cyrus H. Walker as Head of Indian Fighters.

Wordy warfare ruled at the convention of the Indian War Veterans of the Pacific coast today just after it was announced that Grand Commander Cyrus Walker had been elected to succeed himself. Immediately after the result was made known, A. B. Stuart, grand vice commander and the candidate whom Walker had overwhelmingly defeated for the position at the head of the organization, protested Walker's selection.

Taking the stand that there were numbers of veterans who could fill the position and were anxious to do so, he declared Walker had not seen actual service against the Indians, and although he had enlisted was not eligible for the position.

W. D. Fullerton was unanimously elected grand vice commander, following Stuart's refusal to run to succeed himself.

The encampment, which is the twenty-first annual meeting, convened this forenoon in W. O. W. hall, Eleventh and Alder streets, with about 350 veterans, their sons, daughters, wives and widows of veterans.

One action of the session was the adoption of a motion, made by John Minio, to the effect that the organization go on record as favoring the selection of the battleship Oregon to lead the first fleet that steams through the Panama canal. It was unanimously passed, along with another motion by him which places the encampment on record as favoring the proposition for the city to house properly the exhibits of the Oregon Historical society.

Shortly afternoon the business session was adjourned for a luncheon served by sons and daughters of the veterans. Adjournment will be taken at the end of this afternoon's session.

FIREMEN'S BAND MAY JOURNEY TO NEW YORK

If present plans carry, which arrangement seems to be satisfactory to all concerned, it is likely that the Portland fire department band, an organization of 30 pieces, will go to New York August 25, to participate in the fire chiefs' international convention, which meets in New York during the first week of September.

Plans are being arranged by Battalion Chief J. W. Stevens, who declares that the sanction of the necessary persons has already been received, although, not as yet official.

The 30 firemen who will take this trip will be given their annual vacation during the last week of August and the first week of September, of 15 days, which they are allowed. The trip will be paid for by the band and not by the city. In the case of those of the band who cannot get their vacation at this time, substitutes will be provided out of the eligible list, who will be paid by the band.

As a manner of raising funds, a band concert is being planned in which the police band will participate with the firemen, making a band of 60 pieces. The plans will be announced as soon as it is definitely decided that the firemen will make this trip.

"From an advertising point of view, Portland will profit wonderfully, and there will be no expense attached to the city, in this matter," said Battalion Chief Stevens today. "The Portland band is the only firemen's band in the United States. All the players are members of the department."

The plan has been submitted to the Commercial club, which it is understood has looked with favor on it. Other commercial bodies have endorsed the proposition.

If the band goes it may lead the monster parade in New York.

SAID HALIM TO OCCUPY TURKS' ANXIOUS SEAT

(United Press Leased Wire.) Constantinople, June 15.—A new Turkish ministry, formed to succeed the cabinet, headed by Shekfat Pasha, the assassinated grand vizier, was completed today. The new grand vizier is Prince Said Halim, who also holds the portfolio of minister of foreign affairs. The other new ministers are: Suleiman El Bostani, commerce; Izzet Pasha, war; Talat Bey, interior; and Osman Nazim Pasha, public works.

The remainder of the old cabinet is unchanged.

Charleson Ordered South. (United Press Leased Wire.) Bremerton, Wash., June 15.—Commander A. H. Robertson of the receiving ship Charleston, at the navy yard here, received orders to report at once at San Diego and take command of the cruiser Denver. Commander Pope Washington of the Denver will come here to command the Charleston.

Marine Captain Dies Suddenly. (United Press Leased Wire.) Raymond, Wash., June 15.—Captain E. R. Cousin, 76 years old, of Berkeley, Cal., died following a stroke of apoplexy. He was employed here as inspector of the steam schooner Salano, building at the Raymond shipyard. Mrs. Cousin will take the body home for burial.

Hill to Exchange Lands. (Washington Bureau of The Journal.) Washington, June 15.—Acting on instructions of the public lands committee, Senator Chamberlain has reported a bill for an exchange of lands in the Ochoco national forest belonging to a lumber company.

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NURSERYMEN BANISH FEELING OF SUSPICION

Probably the greatest good that has resulted from the organization of the Pacific Coast Association of Nurserymen has been the elimination of the feeling of suspicion and distrust that formerly existed among nurserymen, said Albert Brownell, president of the association, in his annual address to the nurserymen's convention in the Multnomah hotel this morning.

Mr. Brownell urged that the nurserymen get together especially on matters pertaining to legislation or the regulation of inspection. He told of the growth of the association since it was started 19 years ago, and explained that it now has a membership practically as large as that of the American or national association. Mr. Brownell urged that the exhibit features of the annual meetings be made permanent undertakings.

John Hall, Rochester, N. Y., secretary of the American association, reported the report of Charles M. Sizemore, chairman of the transportation committee, showing that results are being attained in the association's efforts for uniform ratings and classifications.

A two hour automobile ride about the city in the afternoon, and the delegates will probably be entertained at the Oaks tonight.

Tomorrow the attendees at the convention will be the guests of the Oregon Nursery company, on a trolley trip to the nurseries at Oregon City. Lunch will be served there. Saturday will be devoted to a Columbia river trip on the Bailey Gatzert.

Roses and carnations in profusion are being given the visitors. The fruit exhibits were materially added to this morning and the extensive decorations furnished by the Portland Floral society were refreshed.

"We desire that there should be something of every minute," said J. B. Pilkington, Portland, vice president of the American association, and chairman of the entertainment committee. "We want the visitors to feel at home while they are here, to have a good time and to return to their respective cities with happy and kind thoughts for Portland and Oregon."

The protective associations allied with the nurserymen organizations are holding business meetings in connection with the convention.

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JOSSELYN MADE GUEST OF HONOR

Retiring President of P. R. L. & P. Banquet at the Arlington Club.

Additional honors were last night bestowed on B. S. Josselyn, retiring president of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, when 50 members of the Arlington club sat down to the banquet board at which Mr. Josselyn was the guest of honor. Mr. Josselyn retired from the presidency of the street car company July 1, after six years' service.

Charles S. Swigert, president of the Pacific Bridge company, acted as toastmaster. Fred V. Holman, general counsel of the P. R. L. & P. Co., was the first speaker. He reviewed the work of Mr. Josselyn, saying that more had been done in the six years of his service as president than had been done in the previous 24 years.

Mr. Josselyn, in replying, said that during the time he has served as president of the company he had always tried to do the best for the greatest number of people, irrespective of cliques. Other speakers were W. W. Cotton, general counsel of the O. W. R. & N. Co., Edward Cookingham, cashier of the Portland National Bank, J. H. Young, president of the S. P. & S. company; W. D. Wheelwright, president of the Pacific Export Lumber company; Drake C. O'Reilly, of the Port of Portland commission, and C. S. Jackson, of the Teton hotel, dropped dead in his chair.

Both Mr. O'Reilly and Mr. Young have known Mr. Josselyn for many years and their talks were of their experiences with him.

Franklin Griffith, the new president of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, was the last speaker. He declared that it was his wish that he should retire at some future date, with as good a feeling manifest for him as the one expressed for Mr. Josselyn.

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
