

WATER WILL RISE TO FIFTH STREET

Willamette Will Mount Still Higher Than Present Stage, According to Today's Forecast; Weather Prediction.

"Should the rain continue to fall as it has for the past few days the river will still reach Fifth street," said District Forecaster A. Beale this morning...

Weather conditions for the next 24 to 36 hours will be showery, says Mr. Beale, and the run-off of rain into the upper Willamette river, where there is a rise reported at all stations, will be responsible for the slight rise predicted...

During the past six days the rainfall here up to 10 o'clock this morning has been 2.83 inches, while the total for the month to date was 3.54 inches.

The wettest June on record here was in 1888 when 5.38 inches of rain fell. In the 48 years from 1871 to the present year inclusive the amount of rainfall has exceeded three inches on but four occasions.

In his forecast District Forecaster Beale says: "Showers tonight and Tuesday with southerly winds."
