

MASS MEETING TO PROTEST CAT AND MOUSE OUTRAGES

Non-Militants Call Big Demonstration to Show They Are Opposed to Way Government Handles Women.

(United Press Leased Wire.) London, July 8.—The "cat and mouse" act is to be the subject of a big mass meeting of protest to be held tonight at Queen's hall under the auspices of the National Political League, one of the most influential of the non-militant woman suffrage societies.

It was this organization that led in the successful agitation against the forcible feeding of suffragette prisoners and the leaders are now just as determined to effect the repeal of Home Secretary McKenna's latest method of dealing with hunger strikers.

"We are not militant," today said Countess De la Warr, one of the prime movers in the league's new crusade, in explaining the purposes of the meeting to the United Press, "but we are not prepared to stand aside and see women sent to death for offenses that, after all, take place in the course of political agitation, and are committed for unselfish motives."

"We feel that the moment has arrived for a strong protest against the present policy of the government. That policy is one of extreme coercion against the unrest due to the existence of a great grievance, and there is no coincident attempt to remove that grievance. Such a treatment of a deeply felt question, at once unstatesmanlike and fundamentally wrong, can only fan the flame of discontent and create still greater unrest and social disturbance."

"The outcry against the practice of forcible feeding, culminating at our great demonstration in King's Way hall on March 18, has forced the withdrawal of that method of injuring the health and endangering the lives of the women involved, not, however, before it had been made clear that the women were prepared to sacrifice their lives even though that form of torture."

"The alternative legislation which the home secretary forced through parliament, in the form of the so-called 'cat and mouse' bill, is no less cruel. The country is now faced with the fact that in its operation women can be sent to death, and are facing death, by this new form of 'inquisition,' the legality of which can be seriously questioned, and the ineffectiveness of which, to produce the desired result, has already clearly been demonstrated."

"Mrs. Pankhurst is now in a most grave condition, and has already suffered more than any political offense can warrant; yet she is again to be arrested, and again to go through another 'hunger strike,' which will certainly mean her death."

MOTHER AND FATHER DISPUTE OVER SON

A bitter row between W. J. Strickler and his divorced wife, now Mrs. Josephine B. Loveland, over their 11-year-old son, is shown by the contest now on. Strickler filed suit against his former wife to enjoin her and her husband from taking the boy outside of the state, from interfering with the boy's mail, and from teaching the boy disrespect for his father. He asks that he be given the privilege of communicating freely with the boy.

Mrs. Loveland, in answer, said that she received a divorce, the custody of the boy and \$12 a month for the boy's support in a decree in Hennepin county, Minnesota, October 23, 1907. Strickler, she said, failed to pay the alimony. In May, 1908, she married Loveland. In 1909, she said, Strickler took the boy away from her for some time, and later she injured an injunction restraining Strickler from approaching, speaking to or laying hands on the boy. Strickler afterward secured a modification of the decree on payment of certain back money due the boy. Mrs. Loveland asserts none of this was ever paid.

The Lovelands came to Portland in 1910, and Strickler followed them when he learned where they were. He said it cost him large sums of money to find their whereabouts, whereabout, and that Loveland is not fit to have charge of the boy and that the surroundings are bad. He has also filed a petition with the juvenile court to require Mrs. Loveland to show cause why he should not be allowed to see the boy occasionally. Mrs. Loveland asks that, on account of the frequent violations of the orders of the Minnesota courts, the injunction keeping him from the boy be made permanent.

FUNERAL OF CIVIL WAR VETERAN IS HELD HERE

Funeral services in memory of the late Elihu Jackson were held yesterday afternoon at the residence of W. H. Higgins, 1301 East Twelfth street north. At their conclusion, the body was shipped to Trenton, Ill., for interment beside that of his wife, who died in 1876.

Mr. Jackson was a veteran of the Civil war, serving throughout the entire war in the One Hundred and Seventeenth Illinois Volunteers. He was an honored member of Sumner Post No. 12, G. A. R., of this city. He died in this city July 5, at the age of 88 years, 10 months and 23 days. He was survived by five sons, seven daughters, 21 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. 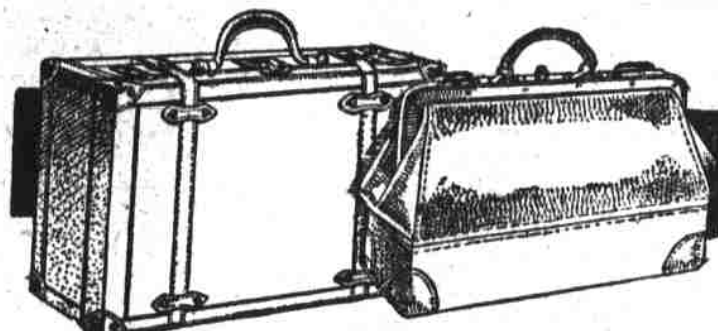
