

BIG PAVING CASE ON AT TILLAMOOK

Restricted Competition, Collusion, Improper Work, Charged by Citizens.

(Special to The Journal.)
Tillamook, Or., July 8.—The paving controversy which has been stirring this city for the past six months has been brought to trial today in the circuit court. The case is brought by about 70 citizens against the city and the Warren Construction company to prevent the levying of the assessment for the paving.

Forney Bagley and Hare, C. W. Fulton and George Bingham. John Geatin is acting for the city while the Warren Construction company has retained Montague, Huntington & Wood and D. J. Maharkey. Judge Campbell of Oregon City presides, Judge Holmes of this district having acted as an attorney for the paving company prior to his appointment to the bench.

Most of this morning was occupied in presenting the issues of the case to the court. Four reasons are assigned by the citizens for asking that the assessments be prevented: First, that the city authorities failed to comply with the city charter in making the contract with the company; second, that the proceedings were invalid because the bids specified only bituminous pavement, which restricted competition; third, that there was collusion between the bidders; fourth, that the paving company failed in many particulars to live up to the contract.

ALSEA VALLEY LONGING FOR A REAL RAILWAY

Alsea, Or., July 8.—The Alsea valley lies in the southern part of Benton and Lincoln counties, and is the valley of the Alsea river, which flows into Alsea bay, about 16 miles south of Yaquina, on the coast. The principal towns are Waldport on Alsea bay, and Alsea, near the upper end of the valley. The valley lies entirely within the coast range, is surrounded by beautiful evergreen hills, and altogether is much like all the little valleys along the coast.

Lying in the coast range, this valley has the benefit of the sea fog, which keeps green the pastures and makes the coast the wonderful dairy country that it is. There are three or more creameries in the valley, all of which do a good business. The valley's products rank with Coos and Tillamook in quality, if not in quantity. Some grain and fruit, and an abundance of garden products are produced. Sheep and goats are profitable on the hills. The lumbering industry is yet undeveloped.

Hunting here is considered good. Many deer and some bear are killed each fall while the birds are each year increasing. In years past, trout fishing was good, but since the hatchery dam was put in ten miles below Alsea, the anglers have met with small success. This dam was carried out by the floods last winter and it is hoped that trout will become more plentiful.

About twenty miles southwest of Philomath is the little village of Alsea, containing close to 100 people. In the town are three stores, two hotels, a blacksmith shop, a creamery, a church, and two school buildings, one built four years ago, and the other last fall. Five teachers were employed last winter and the school is good. The district is very large, making necessary the two buildings and so many teachers. This town is the center of a large and only partly developed territory, so it will undoubtedly grow much as the country is settled.

ROADS ACROSS CASCADES BEGIN TO BE PASSABLE

Bend, Or., July 8.—The deep snows in the Cascades have been cut down by the warm weather of the past few weeks so that the transmountain roads are now

passable. Road gangs that have been working from Eugene to the summit report that the McKenzie pass is now entirely free from snow and the automobiles can cross, and the annual tourist travel from Portland and other Willamette valley points is expected to start soon.

Work of reducing the 25 per cent hills on the west side has been undertaken by the Lane county authorities, with the setting of grade stakes. A reduction of the grade near the summit will be made to 10 per cent or less. The old grades are, of course, steep but entirely practicable for automobiles, and more so this year than ever before owing to improvements that have been made. Lane county has done a lot of work on the McKenzie road below the McKenzie bridge, and in a few years this is likely to become a scenic highway of much importance. Assisting Lane county in the work very materially is the United States forest service.

The Santiam route, farther to the south than the McKenzie, is used mostly by vehicles crossing from this side, and the McKenzie by those coming from the west.
