The trouble at Sing Sing has been saused by the decree that some of the prisoners must go to Auburn, Sing Sing being overcrowded. Two recent fires in the prison here are now believed to have been set by convicts as a protest against their removal. Later 150 convicts, hand suffed and shackled, were transferred to Auburn without serious disorder.
