MCINTYRE GIVES BEST BID TO RITCHIE FOR FIGHT IN SEPTEMBER

Fifteen Thousand and 50 Per Cent of Moving Pictures for Fight With Freddie Welsh.

San Francisco, Aug. 4.—Lightweight champion Willie Ritchie expects to be in a position late today to announce his next match. This was the day set by Ritchie for the closing of bids for his services in a September fight, and offers have been received from all prominent promoters except James W. Coffroth, who will have a conference with Ritchie this afternoon.

The offers received thus far that are being considered are: Chester McIntyre, Vancouver, B. C.; Jess McMahon, New York; William Gibson, New York; Tom McCarey, Los Angeles, and Tom Andrews, Milwaukee. A dozen or more minor offers were received.

McIntyre's offer is the best thus far received. He guarantees Ritchie \$15,000 and 50 per cent of the pictures for a 15 round bout with Freddie Welsh. The terms and the opponents named in the other offers were not made public.

Unless Coffroth has experienced a change of heart since last week he will not "see" the Vancouver offer. He has stated emphatically that he could not afford to raise \$15,000, plus what Ritchie could get out of the pictures, for a 20 round contest here with Harlem Tommy Murphy. Ritchie, it is believed, looks for an offer of \$15,000 from Coffroth, but he does not seem disappointed, the experience of Eddie Graney, who handled the Ritchie-Rivers contest, having acted as a warning.

While the Vancouver offer looks good to the champion, he is said to look with some favor upon the New York offer for 19 round, no decision bouts. However, he has not made up his mind just what he will do in the event that Coffroth's offer does not come up to his expectations.

Johnson was being interviewed under false colors this time, if that would make any difference with him, now that he is 8000 miles away from America. The United Press man pretended to be a French journalist who spoke English with an accent, and who desired to get the dusky pug's impression of his new country. He was preparing to show himself on the Folles-Bergere stage for a medicine ball and almost-dancing turn, the near-dancing being with his latest white wife.

"Ah sholy would mow wdem white folks down!" he grinned, as Americans fell before his imaginary charge. "It would do mah haht good," he went on. "A colored gentlemn ain't got a chance in that country, an' if they ever get me back into it, it'll be feet tuhnt, believe me."

Johnson rubbed powder on his face some more, keeping up the operation until he had several coats. Then a new idea struck him. "Doan yo' say nothin' about me powdahin' my face," he said. "Ah doan want that gettin' back to the states."
