

PORTS OF COLUMBIA MOVEMENT RECEIVES SUPPORT EVERYWHERE

Public Spirited Men in All Sections Urge Immediate Provision for Deep Channel.

Without exception those who are sending acceptances of membership on the committee of the Ports of Columbia heartily commend its purposes and

express intention of according enthusiastic support to the movement to secure a deep ship channel to the sea. Acceptances still continue to pour in on Dr. Alfred Kinney, chairman of the committee, from public spirited citizens of the entire Columbia river region. From a few of the letters received by Dr. Kinney the following extracts are given:

Dredging Necessary Now.
George M. Lamphere, Secretary Business Men's Association, Palouse, Wash.—As the Panama canal is promised to be opened to the commerce of the nations in the year 1914, it is urgently necessary that instead of one dredge now at work on the bar, there should be three or more of large capacity, in order to hasten the completion of the proposed channel. The object and duty of this committee is to unite the influence of the active men of the states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho, and bring it to bear upon the United States government, and upon the governments of the states named to enact legislation

and make money appropriations in amounts sufficient to dig a channel through the Columbia river bar deep enough for the largest ships to freely pass, and to so improve the river as to make it navigable from its mouth to Lewiston, Idaho, and Clarkston, Wash.

Must Have Channel Now.
D. C. O'Reilly, president and manager of the Oregon Round Lumber company, Inc., Lightering and Towing, Portland—It is possible to secure a proper depth of water on the Columbia river bar by dredging or any other means, it should be done and that without delay. While the construction of the north jetty may be expected to accomplish this, it will take some six years to do so and if we have to wait for it, the loss to the Columbia river ports will be incalculable.

J. Frank Spinning, secretary Teel Irrigation District, Echo, Oregon—The people of Portland and Oregon should do all in their power to deepen the channel through the Columbia river bar

and at once. Why put off these great things for years until we are forced to do them. Do it now and do it well.

Prepare for Big Craft.
Joseph Supple, Joseph Supple shipyard and marine ways—If the ports on the Columbia are to get their share of the benefits coming to the Pacific coast from the completion of the Panama canal, we must prepare to accommodate vessels of great draft.

Charles B. Cox, vice president and manager Mabton Valley Fruit company, Mabton, Wash.—It will give me great pleasure to do anything I can to further a project which is certainly of vital interest to all of us in the valley of the Columbia.

J. C. Almsworth, president United States National bank—I think that in this project the interest of Portland and Astoria are one and the same, and that we should cooperate in every way possible for a 40 foot waterway into the Columbia.

Robert Dieck, commissioner, department public works—The importance of this movement certainly impresses itself upon me, and I am very glad to have the opportunity of allying myself with your committee.

ARBITRATION SETTLES THREATENED STRIKE
Mediator Hanger Averts Trouble on S. P. With Help of Railroad.

San Francisco, Aug. 19.—Peaceful relations between the Southern Pacific and its conductors, trainmen, engineers and firemen are established here today after 10 days of negotiations. Commissioner G. W. W. Hanger of the federal board of mediation and conciliation, arranged the settlement. Several weeks ago a strike of the

conductors and trainmen was imminent owing to the refusal of the Southern Pacific to grant their contention for the right of seniority on steam roads to apply to electric suburban lines. The men stood ready to enforce their demands with a strike, 50 per cent having voted to go out. The strike was averted by the company's offer to submit the question to arbitration.

By the terms of the new agreement, conductors, trainmen, engineers and firemen who by seniority are entitled to fill vacancies on steam roads, will receive the same consideration on electric lines, the same rate of pay to extend to both roads. The men are well pleased with the settlement, receiving practically all they contended for.
