GOVERNOR INJURED IN BATTLE WITH MOROS

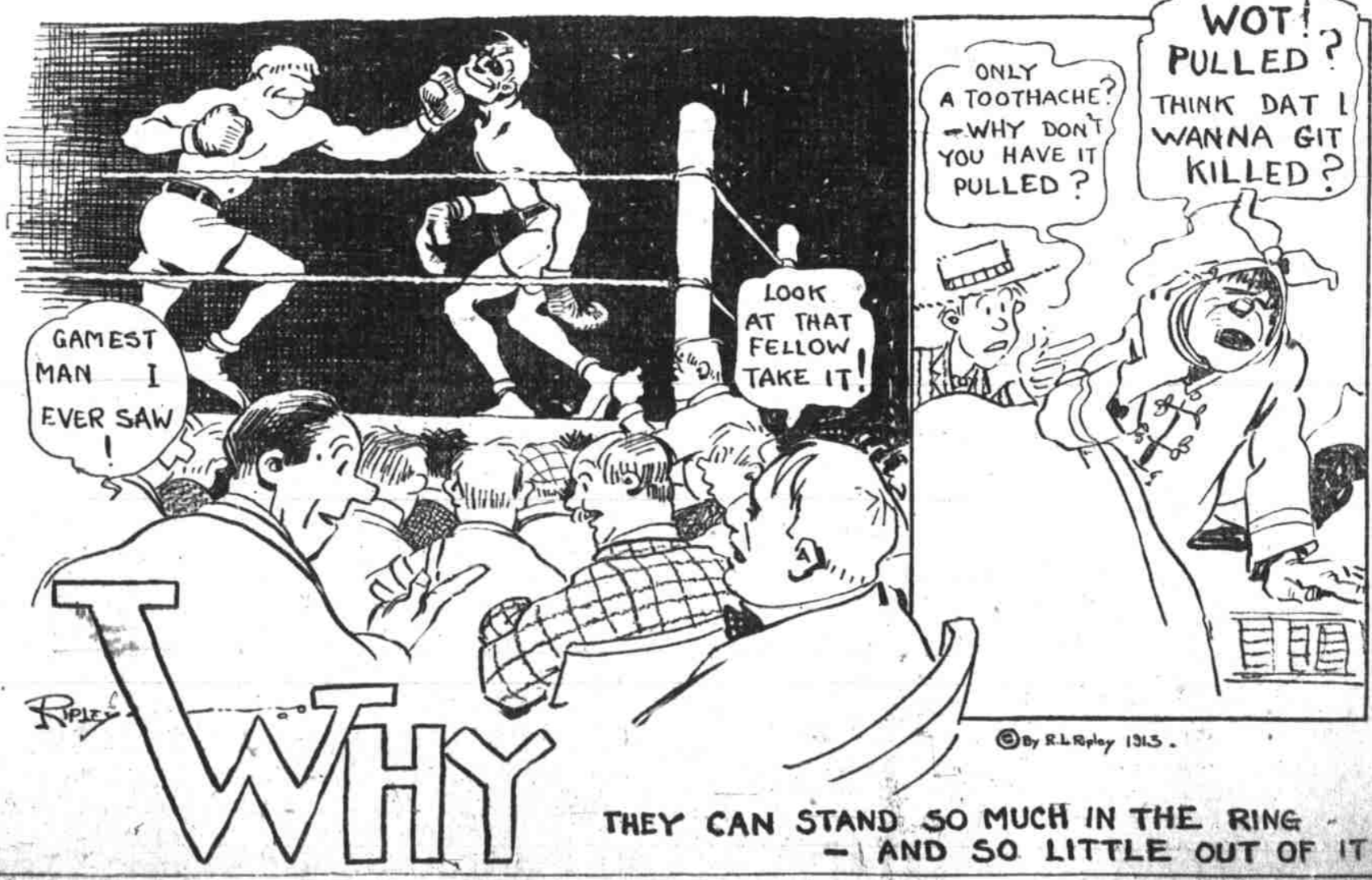
