

STUDY OF MINERAL RESOURCES IS OBJECT OF VISIT OF EXPERTS

New Bureau of Mines and Geology Expected to Get Valuable Results.

(Special to The Journal.) Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., Aug. 28.—Professor H. M. Parks, director of the Oregon bureau of mines and geology, accompanied by Professor A. M. Swartley, a field worker in the same bureau, left Monday for eastern Oregon, where they go to identify and list the mineral resources of Baker, Grant and Walla Walla counties. The bureau of mines was created to investigate the mineral and geological resources of Oregon and encourage a larger production and use.

In pursuance of this work a commission of seven men were appointed by Governor West. This commission is made up of five practical mining men of the state and Presidents W. J. Kerr and P. L. Campbell. Professor Parks, head of the school of mines, Oregon Agricultural College, was made director of the investigations. Among the field workers selected to make personal inspection of certain materials in specified districts of the state are Professor Swartley, of the mines department of the Oregon Agricultural College, and Professor Collier of the University of Oregon. Professor Collier was assigned to the work of investigating the coal deposits of the John Day valley, and Professor Swartley now goes into the same field to study all the useful and precious metals and minerals found there.

Professor Parks will spend this week in Baker county. He expects as far as possible to examine all the mineral substances that may prove of value in the arts and industries of the state. Building stone, cement, clay for brick, tiling and pottery and building materials for all classes of road surfaces, will receive attention. He will next go into Walla Walla county for a week, and purposes to make a careful investigation of the marble and lime resources of that district. Later he will go to The Dalles, Hood River and other Columbia river points. He will then spend some time investigating the resources of the Willamette valley in these materials. Although Portland has the only pottery works now in operation in the state, it has not been demonstrated that there are no other pottery clay deposits. To ascertain whether there are others of commercial importance or not is the work the bureau hopes to accomplish at an early date.

JURORS ARE TO GET EXTRA \$1 PER DAY BUT WHO WILL PAY?

Clerk George Willey of the district court is asking the question, "Why a legislature?" for he feels that the last legislature did him a grave injustice. In changing the justices' courts to district courts the legislature provided that jurors be paid \$2 instead of \$1 a day. Six jurors are needed in each case and the litigants pay the bill, depositing \$6 prior to the trial. Under the new law \$12 is required and no provision was made for the extra \$6. Willey had no trouble until yesterday, when an attorney refused to pay the \$12. Now he wants to know whether or not he must dig into his own pocket for the extra \$6. District Attorney Evans will probably be called upon to determine whether Willey loses his salary or the county foots the bill.

COMPANION OF MASSON ARRESTED EN ROUTE

Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 28.—Joachim Bauche Alcalde, who claims to have accompanied Bidler Masson on several flights over Guaymas harbor, Mexico, was arrested here today as he stepped from a Southern Pacific train, and hustled to the city jail. Special Agent John Bowen of the department of justice, who made the arrest, refused to explain his act, and the jail blotter opposite to Alcalde's name shows only the entry "en route."

Alcalde declares Masson's bomb throwing flights were successful and that he destroyed one federal gunboat at Guaymas. He did not try to explain his presence in Los Angeles.

THE BUYING PUBLIC STUDY THE SELLING METHODS OF BUSINESS HOUSES.

West Side Merchants With Expensive Locations Are Fitted Against Low Rent Competition.

Like many other Portland people, we became curious to know why a furniture store like Calf Brothers—one of the largest in Portland when volume of business is considered—should persist in staying over on the west side. It is generally conceded to be an inferior location.

So we went over and asked our question boldly and we got our answer frankly and without hesitation.

"For purely business reasons," replied Mr. Calf.

"People nowadays don't take much stock in (these) and gold fringe nor in expensive fixtures. They are coming more and more to be careful buyers and to figure prices, based on what an article is really worth."

"We could take our stock and move it over to the best location on the west side and we couldn't do the business because we would have to get double the profit in order to meet the additional expenses. There's no secret to it. People need furniture. They don't get it. They take time to buy furniture. It generally takes all the money they can spare—very often they obligate themselves to pay by the month and they must buy carefully."

"People aren't fools. They know that high rents, and all that, must be paid by someone and the man that pays is the one who buys the furniture. The selling expense is tacked onto the selling price of an article, and the patron that buys is paying in profit on the article their profits of the business expenses." (Adv.)
